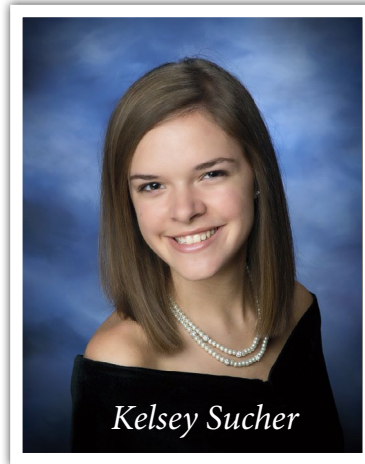

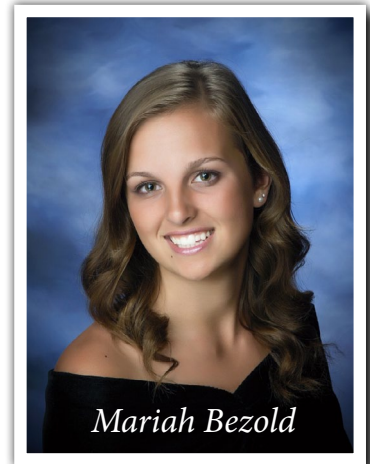
As always, thank you for sending your daughters to Notre Dame Academy. We are blessed to have each and every one of them as part of our community!

Club/Activity Leader Meeting

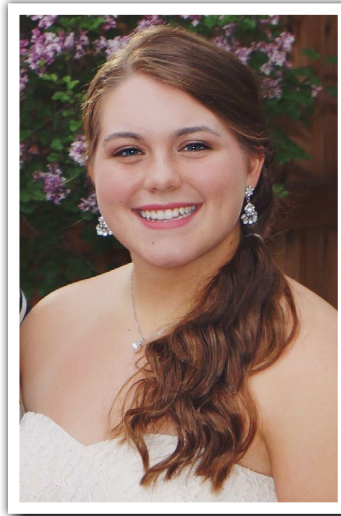

FBLA STUDENT HEADS TO NATIONAL COMPETITION ◀

Under the guidance of teachers, Hillary Johnson and Pat Brennan, Notre Dame Academy sent eight students to the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) Kentucky State Conference in Louisville, Kentucky. The competition was held at the Galt House Hotel from April 18-20.

For the first time in NDA's short 3 year FBLA existence, four students moved on to the final round of the state competition and one qualified for the National Competition. Senior Abbie Macke placed 3rd state wide in the Personal Finance event, moving her on to Nationals which will be held in Atlanta, Georgia June 29 – July 2. Seniors Tess Witt and Rachel Franzen also placed 5th in the state while competing as a team in the Social Media Campaign event. And Freshman Megan Heeb placed in the top 8 of the state in Public Speaking.

Rounding out the 8 members who qualified for the state conference are juniors Claire Benson, Lauren Lawler and Annie Lee, and sophomore, Erika Nageleisen.

Congratulations are in order for these tough competitors and we look forward to another successful year in FBLA in 2016-2017!

NDA INVESTMENT CLUB MEMBERS TAKE FIRST PLACE IN STATE COMPETITION ◀

Each school year, Notre Dame Academy's Investment Club enters multiple four person teams in a state wide competition of the Stock Market Game. A program of the SIFMA Foundation, the Stock Market Game is an online simulation of the global capital markets that engages students in the world of economics, investing and personal finance.

For the first time under the guidance of Mike Dempsey, a Notre Dame Academy board member, and teacher Hillary Johnson, a group of four Notre Dame students, seniors Eliza Lenihan and Hannah Sullivan and sophomores Haley Woodruff and Katy Leonard, placed first in the state of Kentucky.

This is a huge accomplishment as it shows the growth and progress that NDA's business organizations are making throughout the school. So congratulations are in order for these tough competitors and we look forward to another successful year in the Stock Market Game in 2016-2017!

NDA STUDENTS SUCCEED AT S.T.E.M. COMPETITION ◀



Notre Dame Academy's JETS club (Junior Engineering Technology Society) had three teams participate in the TEAMS competition this year. The theme of the event was "Engineering the Tools of Innovation" which allowed students to deepen their knowledge of the tools engineers use to solve problems. Students researched many topics prior to the competition, including energy efficiency, Genomics: sequencing DNA, Optical Physics, semiconductor materials, and the Six Sigma Manufacturing Methods. At the TEAMS competition, members on these teams collaborate in small groups of eight students to

complete a test consisting of two parts; a Multiple-Choice test, and written essays on these engineering topics. The Multiple Choice Part of the test, Part I, was scored on-site and students were aware of their results. The Essays, Part II, are scored at a later time. A third component this year included an observation of how the students work together to solve an engineering problem. All three teams did exceptionally well and I would love to share the results of each team with you!

FACULTY SPOTLIGHT ◀

We are blessed to have many dedicated educators at Notre Dame Academy. Below are a few recent accomplishments of a few of our faculty members. Congratulations to each of them!

DAN MARTIN

NDA Religion teacher Dan Martin was honored to have recently been added to the Greater Cincinnati World Affairs Council's list of specialists. Mr. Martin took a deep interest in politics during 11th grade (1992-1993), and this interest shifted toward diplomacy in his final year of high school. This shift toward foreign policy was a result of his experience as a Kentucky Governor Scholar taking a class from a professor from Lithuania. He pursued this interest further at Georgetown University receiving his undergraduate degree in foreign service. During his time in Washington, DC, he volunteered in Costa Rica for most of one summer and was an intern for a member of congress for one year. Since that time, his academic interests shifted toward theology. Mr. Martin says that he always viewed these two fields as complimentary as both theology and world affairs require one to ask big questions. In his doctoral work in theology at the University of Dayton, he examined how Sargent Shriver's Roman Catholicism impacted his life as a public servant. Shriver helped to shape and launch the Peace Corps, served as the US Ambassador to France, and helped his wife grow Special Olympics International. In Shriver, he found a subject who combined his two biggest academic interests.

NANCY STRATMAN

This summer NDA Social Studies teacher Nancy Stratman was chosen for a very special honor. She is attending a summer institute at Brown University on *Global Refugees: Human Rights, Responsibilities and Responses*. Only 30 applicants were chosen to attend. Mrs. Stratman will use the information she learns to supplement her Current Issues class next school year. Mrs. Straman also recently completed a ten-week course at the Kenton County Government Academy. It is a course that is offered through the Kenton County Attorney's office (Stacey Tapke). The class met at various governmental agencies throughout Kenton County to learn different aspects of local government. Mrs. Stratman said that, "It was quite interesting and I was able to use some of the information to supplement my Government class."
