#### LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Greetings Parents,

As the fourth quarter is underway, we all welcome signs of spring and the hope that the Easter season brings. Of course this includes the anticipation of Spring Break and time to relax and enjoy family and friends. Next Wednesday, before everyone leaves for Spring Break, we will celebrate an Easter prayer service with a special focus on the importance of service.

This week we are celebrating "Body Peace Week" to promote self-respect and positive body image. Young women receive many images especially in the media that support the imperfect notion of a "perfect" body. Our goal this week is to make students aware of how their sense of respect for their own bodies empowers them to make a difference in our world. The week includes a speaker from the Women's Crisis Center addressing the topic of "Safe Dating", a Self Defense class presented by a Kenton County Sheriff and a presentation on the Theology of the Body focusing on the value of Chastity. On Friday, we will speak to the juniors and seniors about how appropriate prom attire relates to their own body image and respect for themselves.

We continue to have students who excel in their academic pursuits. This year 51 students received gold or silver medals in the Scholastic Writing competition. Junior Megan Bieschel and Senior Kathleen Gatti received national silver medals. National award winners receive their recognition at an awards ceremony held at Carnegie Hall in New York City this coming May.

On Wednesday, April 4, our students are invited to attend a Diocesan Mixer at Thomas More College. Members of the NDA Student Council have been involved in planning this event. The cost is \$5 and proceeds will go to the tornado relief fund organized by St. Vincent de Paul to assist the many displaced families.
