


STUDENT LIFE UPDATE

Junior Parents:

This is a reminder that we will be having the March District Choice ACT test for all NDA juniors on March 15. We will register the students for the test during the school day (long homeroom periods) in the coming weeks, so there is not a need to go online and register for this test. The cost of the test is \$39.50 (no writing test) and the students can bring a check (made out to NDA) to the school office for this amount by March 11. Financial assistance is available for those who may need it. This is a real ACT test and the scores can be sent to colleges.

Attention Senior Parents: As of January 1, seniors are now able to fill out the 2016-2017 FAFSA (College Financial Aid Application). It is highly recommended that families complete the FAFSA in the first 2-3 weeks of January. If a family qualifies for Grant money (especially Grants from Kentucky), they are first come, first serve. Most colleges ask that you complete the FAFSA by Feb. 1 or Feb. 15.

SCIENCE NEWS

NDA Chemistry teacher Mrs. Diane Goldcamp is a co-author of a research paper, "Effect of the Denticity of Tripodal Amine Ligands Containing Multiple Oximate Donors on the Catecholase Activity of Their Nickel(II) Complexes," published in the January 2016 issue of the journal Inorganic Chemistry Communications. The work examines how changing the structure of metal-based catalysts can affect how fast compounds called catechols are converted to compounds called quinones. This type of reaction is often seen in protective processes in biochemistry, such as in the browning of fruits and vegetables when they are exposed to oxygen in the air. The observed brown color is caused by the formation of the guinone compounds. For the nickel catalysts studied in the research, it was observed that if the nickel atom in the catalyst had more open spaces for the catechol molecule to bond to the nickel, the "browning" reaction occurred more quickly. Such insights observed for synthetic catalysts can often help explain how much more complex metal-containing enzymes function in biochemistry. The enzymes that undergo this reaction typically use copper atoms. They might research the reaction with copper in place of nickel to see if they observe the same effect.


