

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- As you can see from the dates above, due to Capital Campaign renovations at NDA, our school year will begin after Labor Day and end before Memorial Day.
- Due to the shortened number of days in the school year, next year we will be adding 33 minutes to each school day.
- Each school day will begin at 7:45 a.m. and end at 3:03 p.m.
- All classes will last 52 minutes with 4 minutes in between for changing classes.
- Semesters will be an even number of days with mid-term exams held in January.
- The athletic "Dead Period" will run from June 23 July 13 this summer.
- **IMPORTANT NOTE:** Please remember that although our school year does not begin until September 5, other area schools will begin in early or mid August, therefore fall athletic schedules will remain the same as in past years. Last week, the freshmen had "High School 101" with the NDA Counseling Staff. Below are some conversation starters to have with your freshmen daughters:

- Mrs. Hildreth helped the girls take a "Career Cluster" assessment in our new online tool called Naviance. They
 also started to log Resume information. Ask your student: "What were your top 3 Career Clusters and what specific careers did you get matched with?"
- Mrs. Maggard talked with the girls about good choices regarding their relationships, physical health, digital world, and emotional health. Ask: "What were the 4 components of the "HELP" model of making decisions?"
- Mrs. Monohan discussed Scheduling, the Curriculum Guide and GPA Scales. Ask your daughter: "What are you thinking of taking next year as your Elective?"
- Ms. Burgei talked with the girls about what a Transcript includes and some classes heard advice from current Seniors. Ask your daughter: "What advice did the seniors give you?"

Parent Meetings for Scheduling and PSAT overview:

The only parent meeting left is the junior parent meeting on THURSDAY, February 9 in the NDA Theatre at 6:30 p.m. We will review the scheduling process for the upcoming school year, and relevant grade level information including results of standardized testing for sophomores and juniors. We will ask students to arrive at 7:45 that day to get ready to start by 8 a.m. More details and reminders will follow in an email to students and parents.
