I am writing to you today to share some exciting yet bittersweet news with you. I have been offered the opportunity to take on a new role within the SND USA organization. Beginning on September 1, I will serve as the Executive Director of the SND National Sponsorship and Network Office and Chief Operating Officer of the National Ministry Corporation. Through this new role I will lead the office which provides direction and support to SND sponsored and affiliated ministries in advancing the Educational Vision & Principles of the Sisters of Notre Dame. I sincerely appreciate your dedication to Catholic education and thank you for entrusting your daughter to our care.

As of today, Wednesday, February 24, we have had 0 reported cases of a member of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. As per our requirements, those involved are following the quarantine guidelines in our COVID-19 Response Chart. We have also been informed by members of our NDA community who have had close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19. Those members of our community are also in quarantine.

We have consulted with the Diocese of Covington about these recent cases and we thank the families involved for reporting this information and helping to keep our school community safe.

### Important Reminders:

#### COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Headache
- Fever or chills
- Cough
- · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- · Muscle or body aches

- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- · Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

While these are the most common symptoms of COVID-19, this list does not include all possible symptoms. If your daughter is experiencing ANY of the symptoms above or any other medical symptoms, **PLEASE ERR ON THE SIDE OF CAUTION** and contact our school nurse. By misinterpreting signs and symptoms, we can put others in jeopardy. **PLEASE** do not try to diagnose or interpret symptoms you may be experiencing. We are lucky to have a medical professional at NDA to assist us in these matters.

#### Remote Learners:

Absent students are **NOT** automatically added to the Remote Learner List. Remote learners **MUST** have permission from NDA administration to be on the Remote Learner List. Students can get admin. permission by communicating with <u>Mrs. Grayson</u>, <u>Mrs. Sizemore</u> or <u>Mrs. McLeod</u>.

ALSO, students **MUST** be cleared by Mrs. Grayson, Mrs. Sizemore or Mrs. McLeod prior to coming back to in person classes.

### **Travel Advisory Information:**



We know that travel increases your chances of getting and spreading COVID-19 and that staying home is the best way to protect yourself and others from COVID-19. Therefore, **ALL TRAVEL IS HIGHLY DISCOURAGED FOR NDA STUDENTS THROUGHOUT THE REST OF THE SCHOOL YEAR. PLEASE SCHEDULE YOUR FAMILY VACATION DURING THE SUMMER.** If you are planning to travel **ANYTIME** (including spring break), please see the <u>updated guidelines from the Diocese</u> and the <u>CDC</u> travel guidelines and note that at NDA:

- Prior to your trip, travel **MUST** be reported to our school nurse, <u>Tina Sizemore, RN.</u> (859.292.1843), <u>Mrs. McLeod</u> (859.292.1821) or <u>Mrs. Grayson</u> (859.292.1826).
- International travel will require a 14 day quarantine.
- Domestic travel that meets any of the following criteria will require a mandatory 10 day guarantine:
  - Travel via public transportation such as plane or bus
  - Travel to a to a <u>state with a positivity rate of 15% or higher</u>
- A positive test result showing your daughter has antibodies from an infection that causes COVID-19 and/or a COVID-19 vaccination does not eliminate the need to quarantine after travel.



During the Lenten Season we encourage students to find ways that they can draw closer to God through Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. Below are some opportunities that will be offered:





#### **DRUG FREE CLUB**

Many of NDA's DFCA members are considered "Unconfirmed Members" because they have not yet fully completed the submission of their test results from the Home Testing Kits. If your student has not yet received their Member ID card in the mail, they are probably an "Unconfirmed Member."

There is a simple fix for this! The parent/guardian must complete the simple test result form to confirm with the Drug Free Club that the student achieved a drug-free test using the Home Test Kit that was mailed to your home. To accomplish this, the Parent/Guardian needs the student's Drug Free Club ID Number, which can be found in 3 places: previous emails to parents from Drug Free Club, on the top left of the student's DFCA Member ID card from last year, or from Mrs. Hildreth.

As soon as this step is completed, club status will be updated, and the student will receive in the mail their personalized Club ID Card and the Key Tag for **Confirmed, Active Members!** A temporary ID card can immediately be printed upon completion of the form, and the student is then eligible for all of our rewards! 
