The Diocese of Covington is committed to creating and building safe environments in its schools and parishes. Next Friday, all Notre Dame Academy students will attend a safety presentation facilitated by Julie Feinauer, School Counselor at St. Henry District High School. Mrs. Feinauer will be speaking to our students about her experiences and how to be safe and aware in your environment. She will touch upon how to identify abuse of all types.

All students will participate in this program unless Notre Dame Academy receives written notification from a parent or guardian indicating that permission is not granted for his or her daughter to participate. NDA MOCK TRIAL TEAM WINS REGIONAL TITLE ◀

Notre Dame Academy's Gold Mock Trial Team placed first at the 2018 Mock Trial regional tournament this past weekend in Louisville, Kentucky. The team will move on to compete against fifteen Kentucky teams in the Mock Trial State Tournament at the Kenton County Justice Center in Covington, Kentucky on March 2-4.

Under the direction of moderator, Ms. Hillary Johnson and coaches Katelyn Mollett and Amy Hebbeler, NDA's Gold and Navy Mock Trial teams have worked very hard this year. Their efforts have paid off giving the NDA Gold Mock Trial Team a regional title and individual Best Attorney and Best Witness awards for both teams. Julia Hughes was named a Best Attorney, Elly Piatt and Natalie Gerdes were both named Best Witnesses and Mara Schutt was named both Best Attorney and Best Witness.

This year's tournament is different than in past years. Kentucky teams were divided into two regions (Lexington and Louisville). Each region hosted a two-day (four round) regional tournament. The top eight schools from each region are advancing to the Kentucky High School Mock Trial State Championship in March.

Graduate Study Opportunity

Chelsea Esmeier (NDA Graduate, Class of 2010) is a doctoral candidate in the School of Psychology at Xavier University. She is conducting a study for her dissertation that requests the participation from NDA students. The purpose of the study is to examine female adolescents' motivations to control their appearance in photographs presented online, and how these motivations may affect their wellbeing. The results of the study have implications for promoting female adolescents' healthy use of social media. The students who participate in this study will be asked to respond to a series of questionnaires about their personality and their motivations to control their appearance in photographs. All information collected in the study is confidential, and participation is voluntary. Data collection will be held before and after school (at 7:45 a.m. and 3:10 p.m.) on Wednesday 2/28, 3/14, and 3/21) and will last approximately 45-60 minutes. Students can sign up for one of these sessions upon returning their parental permission forms, which were sent home with students. All students who return a completed parental consent form by Tuesday, February 27 (regardless of their parents' willingness to grant permission for their involvement in the study) will be entered into a drawing to win one of several \$15 Target gift cards. Please have your daughter return the signed parental permission form to the NDA main office.

Junior ACT and Freshmen/Sophomore CERT

On Tuesday, February 27 all of the freshmen and sophomores will be taking the College Equipped Readiness Test (www.cert-forschools.com). They will be using their Ipads and have immediate results for this practice ACT test. They will be dismissed at 2 p.m. that day.

That same day the juniors will be taking the ACT. They are registering with NDA and the test is already paid for as a part of tuition. They will also be dismissed at 2 p.m. that day.


