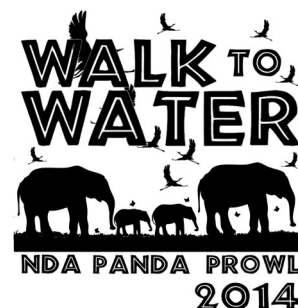

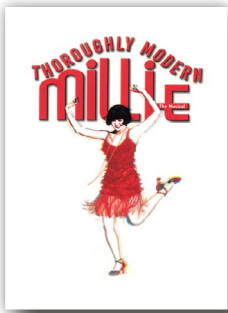
SCHOLASTIC AND SHAKESPEARE: THE ENGLISH GAMES ◀

The English Department proudly announces that seniors Szofia Komaromy-Hiller and Abigail Martin, students of Ms. Lynn Dickman, and junior, Hannah Good, student of Ms. Emily Sampson, have earned silver medals in the 2014 Scholastic Art and Writing Competition. Szofia won for her two writing portfolios and a humor piece; Abigail won for her writing portfolio and short story; Hannah won for persuasive writing. In addition, Abigail received the prestigious National American Voices Award and Szofia earned the Danny Miller Award, an award given to a Scholastic winner locally who has demonstrated consistent excellence in competitive writing. Congratulations to these talented students, their teachers and parents, whose instruction and encouragement have helped them hone their talents and realize well-deserved success.



The top states that won portfolio medals are: New York (9), South Carolina (9), Maryland (7), Kentucky (4), Texas (4). All of the Kentucky portfolios belonged to the Northern Kentucky Writing Region and Notre Dame Academy contributed 75% to our state's portfolios. Out of all the portfolios that won medals (65 in total), Notre Dame Academy can claim 5% of them. At the national level, there were a total of 8 Gold Portfolios, 11 Silver With Distinction, and 46 Silver Medals across 23 states and one from Canada. Kentucky is in the top half of the nation when it comes to writing and NDA made major contribution thanks to its accomplished authors competing under the guidance of their outstanding teachers.

Congratulations are also in order for Emma Duerstock who made it to the second round of the English Speaking Union's Shakespeare competition. She was one of six finalists and although she did not win, as a freshman she represented Notre Dame impressively. (She has also brushed up on her Shakespeare in anticipation of next year's competition.)
