May you know God's goodness each day,



IMPORTANT INFORMATION: FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE/WORK STUDY

In order to be eligible for the work/study program at Notre Dame Academy one must follow a two step process:

- 1. The family must first apply for the Private School Aid Service (PSAS) by sending in the 2013-2014 PSAS Student Aid Form. The cost is \$25.00. All forms should be postmarked no later than April 5, 2013.
- 2. Families who are eligible for PSAS money must also apply for a school job. This should be done by May 1, 2013. A job application form can be downloaded from the NDA website or a copy can be found at the school office. Jobs are assigned during the summer and families will be notified about their acceptance in the program toward the end of the vacation period.
