

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents.

As we journey together through this holy season of Lent, we remember the importance of our identity as a Catholic high school. Our students have many opportunities not only during the Lenten season, but throughout the school year, to grow in their faith at NDA. Forming the young women of Notre Dame Academy to be servant leaders is an integral part their experience here. Teaching them the importance of putting their faith into action and their responsibility to develop their God-given gifts and to share those gifts with others are key components of an NDA education.

Faith formation is not limited to our Religion classes at NDA, it can be seen in every subject area and each classroom throughout the day. We pray at the beginning and end of each day. We pray a decade of the rosary daily before school in our chapel. We celebrate the Eucharist together regularly and our community is offered the opportunity for the sacrament of reconciliation frequently. Our students participate in retreats that further develop their relationship with God. Our Chaplain, Fr. 








GO PANTRY UPDATE FROM TLC

Prayer - A decade of the Rosary is prayed every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday at 7:40 a.m. in the chapel. Mass is held every Friday morning at 7:20 a.m. in the chapel. Reconciliation will be offered through Religion Classes on Wednesdays throughout Lent. Students are encouraged to wear Purple accessories/shirts with their uniforms on Wednesdays as a way to remind us of this prayerful season.

Fast - Students are encouraged to "give up" something during the Lenten Season - suggestions were shared in the student bulletin. Throughout Lent we will encourage students to fast from certain things for a day - for example - fast from gossip on Thursday, February 25. etc.

Also, sophomore Kira Kent was also named the #6 Witness in the state.










WELCOME TO THE PANDA FAMILY!

DRUG FREE CLUB

Over 200 of NDA's DFCA members are STILL considered "Unconfirmed Members" because they have not yet fully completed the submission of their test results from the Home Testing Kits. If your student has not yet received their Member ID card in the mail, they are probably an "Unconfirmed Member."

There is a simple fix for this! A parent/guardian must complete the simple test result form CLICK HERE FOR LINK to confirm with Drug Free Club that the student achieved a drug-free test using the Home Test Kit that was mailed to your home. To accomplish this, the Parent/Guardian needs the student's Drug Free Club ID Number, which can be found in 3 places: previous emails to parents from Drug Free Club, on the top left of the student's DFCA Member ID card from last year, or from Mrs. Hildreth.

As soon as this step is completed, club status will be updated, and the student will receive in the mail their personalized Club ID Card and the Key Tag for **Confirmed, Active Members!** A temporary ID card can immediately be printed upon completion of the form, and the student is then eligible for all of our rewards! **Contact Mrs. Hildreth with any questions.**



Alcohol is the most widely used substance amongst young people.

• 90% of alcoholic drinks consumed by teenagers are consumed through binge drinking. (For women 4 or more drinks in 2 hours; for men 5 or more drinks in 2 hours)

Why is this a big deal?

The adolescent brain is still developing, and won't finish until their mid-late 20's.

Alcohol can have a serious impact on ongoing brain development. Here's how:

- Alcohol can damage the part of a teen's brain responsible for memory and learning
- Teens that drink regularly have smaller *prefrontal lobes than teens who do not drink (*responsible for planning, judgement, decision making, impulse control)
- Alcohol is a depressant and actually causes the teen brain to slow down The safest option is for teenagers to delay drinking as long as possible. But...teenagers drink. So what can you as parents do about this?

Start having conversations.

In a recent survey given to many of our Drug Free Clubs members, it was revealed that *the number one topic our students have questions about is alcohol.* (I know, we were surprised too.) It was the "drug" they felt they knew the least about, despite being the one they statistically use the most.

Education is a powerful tool. Don't be afraid to start the conversation.
