

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL <

Dear Parents,

Happy St. Patrick's Day! It is hard to believe that one year ago today, after the initial shutdown due to COVID-19, our students and teachers had their first day of Remote Learning @ NDA. As we look at the date and memories pop up on our devices, we can't help but think of what was happening in our lives just a year ago. It's important to look back and think about how far we've come and remind ourselves of our future goals and our mission in life. I think it's also beneficial for us to focus on gratitude and recognize what is valuable and meaningful to us. As I reflect upon the past year and all that our NDA community experienced in the face of the coronavirus global pandemic, I can't help but feel abundantly blessed. I appreciate all that our students and faculty members have sacrificed this past year to remain engaged in meaningful learning. I am also grateful for the perspective and resilience that they have shown. We have published a bit of a historical retrospective of our COVID-19 experience this past year on our website. Last week we celebrated 100 days of in-person learning this school year. It was certainly something to commemorate during this challenging year. As we move toward the end of the school year, I wanted to touch base with you on a few things regarding our CO-VID-19 protocols and procedures.

We have seen a significant drop in our COVID-19 positive cases on our campus. If you have been reading the Panda Press Weekly, you know that we have only had 7 reported cases of a member of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last month compared to 30 the month prior. Although we are seeing a notable decrease in the number of positive cases of COVID-19 at NDA, we will continue to stay the course continuing to follow the COVID-19 mitigation protocols we have in place and those required by the Diocese. These protocols are listed on the following page.

Although members of our community may have COVID-19 antibodies or have already gotten the COVID-19 vaccine, these situations DO NOT eliminate the need to follow the protocols and procedures in place. We have made it through 70% of the school year following these mitigation strategies and they have worked well for us. Last week's 100 Days of In-Person Learning celebration is proof of that.

I would also like to point out a few things regarding travel as spring break is quickly approaching:

- All travel must be reported to our school nurse, Tina Sizemore, RN.
- International travel will require a 14 day quarantine upon your return
- Domestic travel that meets any of the following criteria will require a mandatory 10 day quarantine upon your return:
 - Travel via public transportation such as plane or bus
 - Travel to a to a state with a positivity rate of 15% or higher

If you are traveling over spring break, please continue to follow COVID-19 mitigation strategies and monitor the state positivity rate of your destination. Even if you travel to a state with a positivity rate lower than 15%, if it rises

above 15% while you are there, you will need to guarantine for 10 days upon your return.

Thank you for allowing us to partner with you in your daughter's Catholic education!

Prayer - A decade of the Rosary is prayed every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday at 7:40 a.m. in the chapel. Mass is held every Friday morning at 7:20 a.m. in the chapel. Reconciliation will be offered through Religion Classes on Wednesdays throughout Lent. Students are encouraged to wear Purple accessories/shirts with their uniforms on Wednesdays as a way to remind us of this prayerful season.

Fast - Students are encouraged to "give up" something during the Lenten Season - suggestions were shared in the student bulletin. Throughout Lent we will encourage students to fast from certain things for a day - for example - fast from gossip on Thursday, February 25. etc.

Almsgiving - Students are encouraged to find ways to give of their time and treasure in a way that benefits others. Whether that is through a service project or donating to one of our collections. We had a collection for GoPantry in February and we are taking part in the Rice Bowl Project this year as well. Rice Bowls were handed out in Religion classes last week and will be collected during Holy Week.


If a family receives financial assistance, a family member is expected to have a work study job.



ALUMNAE STORYBOARD ┥


