

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL <

Dear Parents,

I hope you have had an opportunity to get outside this past week and enjoy the beautiful spring weather God has given us in this fifth week of Lent. It is a wonderful time of year to take a walk, enjoy the sunshine and talk to God. In this season of Lent, we are given the opportunity to consider the deeper truths of our faith. We prepare for Easter by taking quiet time of contemplation and we focus on the love and mercy God shows us in so many ways - most especially in the promise of His resurrection.

Spring is definitely in the air this week at Notre Dame Academy. It is wonderful to see our students enjoying lunch and a few of their classes outside. They have been working hard this semester and as much as they love being on campus this school year, I know they are excited for Easter break.

We are currently preparing for the safe and healthy return of our students to in-person learning after Easter break. To that end, we have asked students to report any and all upcoming travel plans. If you are planning to travel anytime during the remainder of this school year, please make note of the following:

- Prior to your trip, travel MUST be reported to our school nurse, Tina Sizemore, RN. (859.292.1843), Mrs. McLeod (859.292.1821) or Mrs. Grayson (859.292.1826)
- International travel will require a 14 day quarantine
- Domestic travel that meets any of the following criteria will require a mandatory 10 day quarantine:
 - · Travel via public transportation such as plane or bus
 - Travel to a to a state with a positivity rate of 15% or higher

If you are traveling over Easter break, please continue to follow COVID-19 mitigation strategies and monitor the state positivity rate of your destination. Even if you travel to a state with a positivity rate lower than 15%, if it rises above 15% while you are there, your daughter will need to quarantine for 10 days upon your return.

Students who reported travel plans will receive an email from our school nurse, Tina Sizemore, RN. in the next week to confirm any necessary remote learning they may be required to do after the break. I would like to thank our students for being so cooperative about reporting their upcoming travel plans. It is critical to the safe return of our students after Easter break that we are all forthcoming and work together in order to keep our community safe and healthy.


As you may have seen in the news, the CDC has updated its guidance for schools. Earlier this month, the agency announced it "now recommends that, with universal masking, students should maintain a distance of at least 3 feet in classroom settings." In some cases, this new guidance will allow us to keep all students in one classroom without the need for auxiliary classrooms. I will work with individual teachers to make adjustments to classroom capacity. The expectation will remain that students must stay 6 feet apart outside of the classroom. We will begin following this new guidance after Easter break.

FINAL FORMS FOR CURRENT FRESHMEN THROUGH JUNIORS


Hello Parents and Students. Please login to FinalForms to complete and sign all required forms for the 2021-2022 school year. Remember, FinalForms saves data from season-to-season and year-to-year, so your updates are critical for the accuracy of our records. You should have received your daughter's course requests which were sent to your email on Monday, March 22. This information is important for the "Scheduling Agreement" tab in FinalForms.

What information will I need to register for next year?

LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES <

During the Lenten Season we encourage students to find ways that they can draw closer to God through Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. Below are some opportunities that will be offered:

Prayer - A decade of the Rosary is prayed every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday at 7:40 a.m. in the chapel. Mass is held every Friday morning at 7:20 a.m. in the chapel. Reconciliation will be offered through Religion Classes on Wednesdays throughout Lent. Students are encouraged to wear Purple accessories/shirts with their uniforms on Wednesdays as a way to remind us of this prayerful season.

Fast - Students are encouraged to "give up" something during the Lenten Season - suggestions were shared in the student bulletin. Throughout Lent we will encourage students to fast from certain things for a day - for example - fast from gossip on Thursday, February 25. etc.






2021 KENTUCKY GIRLS STATE PROGRAM
