

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

I hope you are having a good Wednesday. While the snowy trees on campus were beautiful this morning, I think we are all glad to see the snow melt this afternoon as we anxiously await more seasonal weather.

You should have received an email from NDA this morning with a <u>letter</u> from Kendra McGuire, Superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Covington, along with the updated <u>Diocesan COVID-19 Return to School Requirements</u> document. As mentioned in the letter, the Diocesan COVID Committee approved significant updates to our church, school and athletic protocols in light of the many changes that have come from the CDC, the Kentucky Department of Health, and our local health department. I briefly mentioned a few of the updated COVID-19 protocols last week in my letter in the Panda Press Weekly including:

- We are no longer conducting temperature checks for students, staff or visitors upon entry into the school building or athletic events.
- In order to ensure a safe and healthy environment for our community following spring break, we will continue to use our COVID-19 Symptom Checker through next Friday however, after that, we will discontinue using our COVID-19 Symptom Checker on a daily basis.
- Moving forward, those who have been fully vaccinated will no longer need to follow our NDA travel quarantine requirements. (Fully vaccinated means two weeks after the final dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.)

While we are making these changes to our COVID-19 protocols, please know that we feel strongly about continuing to follow COVID-19 mitigation strategies at NDA. We are still in a global pandemic and we recognize that COVID-19 remains a threat to many members of our community, namely our students who have not had the opportunity to get vaccinated yet. Please continue to keep NDA updated on any COVID-19 related issues involving your family or travel plans.

As the end of April quickly approaches, we begin to look toward the end of the school year and our exam schedule. This will be the first exam experience for our freshmen and only the second one for our sophomores. Exams usually raise the anxiety level a notch and I am sure this year will not be different. Please know that Mrs. Grayson and I are working closely with our Student Services Department to alleviate stress for our students during this important time. We will be adding additional Panda Prime Time slots and Exam Fest days after school to help us in the effort. I encourage you to talk to your daughter about her exams and make sure that she is making healthy choices in the upcoming weeks to reduce her stress level as we head into this exam period.

I hope you have a wonderful week and I thank you for partnering with us in your daughter's Catholic education!




NDA COVID-19 INFORMATION

IMPORTANT GRADUATION INFORMATION










2021 KENTUCKY GIRLS STATE PROGRAM
