LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL ◀

Dear Parents,

I hope this evening finds you all safe and healthy. While none of us knew quite what we were in for on Ash Wednesday, the sacrifices we are making in our everyday lives through the COVID-19 crisis remind us that our Lenten journey is not over. During Lent, we focus our hearts on the cross and resurrection of Christ. We spend time in prayer and reflection and surrender ourselves to God our Father. Today we sacrifice our normal, everyday lives for executive stay at home orders and social distancing. Rather than concentrating on all that we are missing during this global epidemic, we must try to focus on the gifts God gives us during Lent - repentance and grace.

We continue to do our best as a learning community to keep our students engaged in their studies in this, our third week of Remote Learning @ NDA. We understand that this is a stressful time and we know this isn't easy for our students, especially when they are missing their friends and social lives. Each day I tell our students to "Make Good Choices" and now is certainly the time to do that. We must be diligent in slowing the spread of COVID-19 to protect ourselves and everyone around us. Please take a look at the "**GOOD CHOICES**" list on page 3 of today's Panda Press Weekly to help you and your family do your part to slow the spread. **One of the good choices listed is for students to stay home and avoid remote learning with friends.** This is a tough one I know, but good choices aren't always going to be easy choices! **It's very important that everyone in our NDA community does their part to make a difference in the world.**

PLEASE NOTE: You should have received an email from NDA today with an attached letter from Mr. Michael Clines, Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Covington. As you will read in the letter, the Diocese has made the decision to begin Easter break for Catholic schools in the Diocese of Covington on April 7. Our Easter break will therefore begin on April 7 and go through April 17. While we are currently scheduled to return to school on Monday, April 20, that date is likely to be extended. If that date is extended, Notre Dame Academy will return to Remote Learning on April 20. We will be in touch as soon as we have further information regarding the date our students will return to school.

COVID-19 GOOD CHOICES

Here are some “**GOOD CHOICES**” that everyone in our NDA community can make to do their part to slow the spread of COVID-19 and make a difference in the world:

- **STAY HOME** - avoid any non-essential travel. Avoid social gatherings. Stay home if you are sick, except to get medical care. Most importantly for our students, **DO NOT PRACTICE REMOTE LEARNING WITH FRIENDS**. Remember, the best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.
- **PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING** by keeping at least 6 feet — about two arm lengths — away from others if you must go out in public. Avoid close contact with people who are sick. **STUDENTS - PLEASE stay connected with friends through video and phone calls, texts and social media.**
- **WASH YOUR HANDS** often with soap and water for at least 30 seconds, especially after being in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- **AVOID TOUCHING YOUR EYES, NOSE AND MOUTH** with unwashed hands.
- **CLEAN AND DISINFECT HOUSEHOLD SURFACES** daily and high-touch surfaces frequently throughout the day. High-touch surfaces include phones, remote controls, counters, tabletops, doorknobs, bathroom fixtures, toilets, keyboards, tablets and bedside tables. Follow CDC guidance.
- **COVER YOUR COUGHS AND SNEEZES**. Use a tissue to cover your nose and mouth, and throw used tissues in a lined trash can. If a tissue isn't available, cough or sneeze into your elbow — not your hands. Wash your hands immediately.
- **STAY INFORMED ABOUT WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR COMMUNITY** and **ALWAYS** follow the directions of state and local authorities.

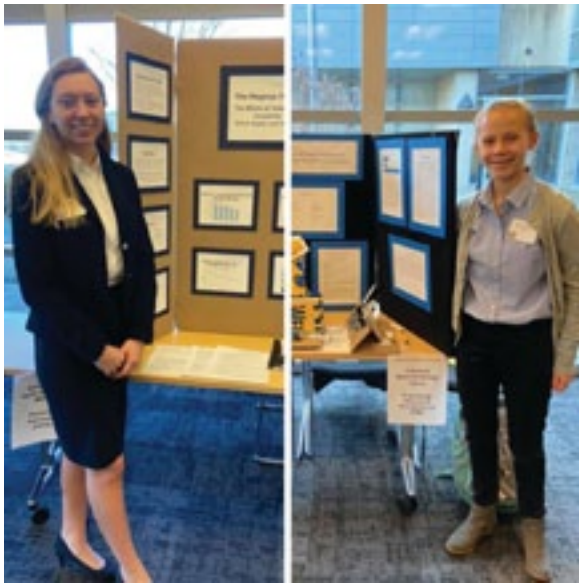

SCIENCE RESEARCH STUDENTS PLACE AT STATE ◀

Thirteen NDA Science Research students qualified at the Science and Engineering Fair of Northern Kentucky (SEFNK) in February to compete at the Kentucky Science and Engineering Fair (KYSEF) this past weekend. The customary in-person state competition at Eastern Kentucky University was replaced with a virtual format to adhere to public health recommendations.

Several of our NDA Science Research students competed in the first ever virtual science & engineering fair in Kentucky's history using Zoom meetings to present their research. NDA senior Molly Kleier placed third in the Physics category with her project: *The Magnus Force: The Effects of Turbulence Caused by Stitch Depth and Pattern* and NDA freshman Natalie Janzaruk placed third in the Materials Science category with her project: *How the Density of Liquids in Hydraulic Actuators Affect the Strength of an Armature*.

A few weeks ago, Mrs. Perrino's engineering and computer science students had a great time and learned a lot about women in science, technology and engineering at Safran Landing Systems in Walton, KY. In addition to learning about the creation of carbon fiber brake pads and the processes involved in building a braking system for aircraft, they learned that Safran aircraft landing gear are responsible for over 70,000 safe aircraft landings everyday from one of their 3 landing systems facilities in France, Malaysia, and Walton, KY.
