Dear Parents,

This morning we had our last faculty/staff meeting of the 2020-21 school year. Our Campus Minister, Mrs. Bridget Price, always begins these meetings with a prayer that she often writes herself. NDA COVID-19 INFORMATION

REMEMBER, the <u>NDA COVID-19 Information page</u> on the website has many important resources for parents and students.

IMPORTANT UPDATES

The Diocesan COVID-19 Committee has reviewed the recent guidance from the Governor's office and the CDC regarding the use of **masks outdoors**. They have updated their guidance with the following changes:

- Masks are no longer required when students or staff are outdoors. This
 includes recess, PE and other outdoor school activities.
- Student athletes and coaches are no longer required to wear masks at outdoor athletic activities.
- Spectators are no longer required to wear masks at outdoor sporting events.
- For outdoor sports, concession stand workers do not have to wear masks as long as they can distance from other workers.

The <u>Diocese of Covington COVID-19 Return to School Requirements</u> document has been updated with these changes.

ALSO: If a student is absent due to an appointment to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, that will be considered an Excused Absence. If a student misses school due to side effects from the vaccine - that will also be considered an Excused Absence. The Excused Absence form will NOT need to be filled out however, students will need to provide medical documentation and/or a copy of their CDC vaccination card to our school nurse, Tina Sizemore, RN. at 859.292.1843 or sizemore@ndapandas.org or Mrs. McLeod in the front office 859.292.1821 or mcleods@ndapandas.org org for the absence to be excused.


NDA/CCH COMBINED EVENT AT PAUL BROWN STADIUM


The Class of 2021 has identified this as a formal event, and attire should adhere to NDA's dress code which includes the following:

- Neckline should be high enough to avoid showing cleavage. A modesty panel may be necessary.
- · Length of outfit/dress should extend beyond fingertips when arms fully extended (this includes slits at any place on the dress).
- Back of dress should not extend below the back curvature.
- Cut outs in dress are not permitted on areas typically covered by dress (midriff, chest area, etc); a mesh lining or otherwise appropriate fabric could be sewn in to address this issue.
- Sides of dress should properly cover the chest area.
- · Masks must be worn throughout the evening except when outdoors and when eating or drinking at your table.


Parking is included in the cost of this event, and passes were handed out during homeroom yesterday. Directions for the parking garage are also included on the pass. Have fun Class of 2021!
