- **BEST WAY:** 1. icloud (make sure you are signed in and backed up)
 - 2. Sync your Notability to Dropbox
- 3. Sync your Notability to Google Drive DECENT:

The tennis team ended their season with a strong third place finish at the state tournament in Lexington. The doubles team on Catriona Shaughnessy and Laura Irons capped off their senior season with a State Runner up Title in doubles tournament.

The track team placed 10th overall Saturday in the State Championship Meet in Louisville. The Pandas turned in terrific performances to complete the season and 15 performers qualified for the event! Top finishers include senior Amy Hansen who clocked in with a time of 5 minutes and 4.41 seconds to finish third in the 1600 meter run and in the 3200m run, Amy placed 8th. Sophomore Mandy Arnzen placed third in the long jump with a jump of 17 feet 3.25 inches and placed 8th in the triple jump. The Pandas placed in the top 8 in three of the four relay events and high jumper Marisa Lorch tied for 8th place.
