GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL PARTICIPANTS

Notre Dame Academy is proud to have ten students participating in the 2015 Kentucky Governor's School Programs. Seven of our students were selected for the Kentucky Governor's Scholars Program (Courtney Blank, Mariah Bezold, Kirsten Richards, Kelsey Sucher, Lily Thaman, Emily Walter and Madeline Wermeling). Some of these young women spent five-weeks at Morehead State University and others are finishing up their five-weeks residential program at Bellarmine University and Murray State University this week. Earlier in the summer, two of our students participated in the Kentucky Center Governor's School for the Arts (Lauren Darpel and Rikki Buchberger). One NDA student had the opportunity to participate in the Governor's School for Entrepreneurs (Kelly Schmahl). A total of 8 NDA students were also selected as alternates for the three programs.

GO MORGAN - GO USA!

The U.S. Girls' Youth National Volleyball Team finalized its 12-player roster that will represent the United States at the 2015 FIVB Girls' U18 World Championship in Lima, Peru, on August 7-16 and NDA's Morgan Hentz is included on that roster!

Players were selected through USA Volleyball High Performance tryouts held across the country. The team represents eight states and eight USA Volleyball regions. Morgan spent two weeks in July at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo., as the roster was shaved down from 20 to 12. The dozen players continued training July 24-28 before heading to the FIVB Volleyball Girls' Youth World Championship set for Aug. 7-16 in Peru. Group play will be held from Aug. 8-12, followed by bracket play Aug. 14-16.

Prior to the World Championship event, Morgan traveled with the team to Buenos Aires, Argentina, to participate in a Pre-World Championship Competition hosted by the Argentina Volleyball Federation. She will then travel to Lima on Aug. 4 to train and acclimate before the World Championship.

UNIFIED 4 UGANDA LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

Leaders of Notre Dame's Uganda Panda Club attended a three day summit at the beginning of June at Xavier University. Francie Case, Katie Stratman and Claire Dunlevy attended the event hosted by Unified 4 Uganda (U4U) - a Cincinnati Non-Profit that financially and emotionally supports the education of destitute children in northern Uganda through the empowerment of American youth. As our own Uganda Panda Club strives to connect with our sister school in Buseesa, Uganda, the U4U organization will enable students in Park Hills, Kentucky, learn more about the culture and people of Uganda.
