

NDA STUDENTS EARN AP SCHOLAR AWARDS

Congratulations to our newly named AP Scholars and AP Scholars with Distinction! An AP Scholar Award is granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams. An AP Scholar with Distinction Award is granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

The AP Program recognizes high school students who have demonstrated outstanding college-level achievement through AP courses and exams with the AP Scholar Awards. Although there is no monetary award, each award-winning student receives a certificate, and the award is acknowledged on any AP score report that is sent to colleges after the award has been conferred. AP Scholar Awards are added to students' online score reports in late August.


