

# LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Greetings parents,

With Labor Day just around the corner, the school year has gotten off to a great start. Faculty, staff and students are enthusiastic about the 2013-14 school year and excited that our journey has begun.

Please note that there will be no school next Monday (9/2) and Wednesday (9/4) is a late start to accommodate a faculty meeting. Picture Day is September 6 in the morning. Your daughter will be given her picture forms next Tuesday during homeroom.

The Instructional Technology Office is currently in the process of finalizing iPad set-up for all students. This involves updating the enrollment for each student in the JAMF Mobile Device Management System. It is imperative that students back-up their iPads (which is something they should all be doing regularly). Mrs. Mullee has provided tutorials on back-up procedures and reenrollment on our website on the <u>iPad 1:1 Initiative</u> page. All students will receive an email about these processes. Please reinforce with your daughters that their iPads must be backed up. This is the student's responsibility and NDA cannot guarantee data retrieval.

The juniors took an ACT practice test this morning as part of a program sponsored by Torchprep – the ACT Boot Camp providers. Torchprep will meet with the juniors next Wednesday at 8:00 a.m. to review the test and strategies for taking standardized tests. They will hold an informational meeting for parents on September 17 at 7:00 p.m. Please watch for further details.

Parent Mini Night is just around the corner on September 11 from 7:00-9:00 p.m. This is a special evening when you can visit each of your daughter's classes for a 10-minute overview about course expectations and activities. Your daughter will bring home her Wednesday schedule for you to follow that night. This is not a time for individual parent - teacher conferences as the teachers will be addressing parents for the entire class. If you need an individual consultation with a teacher that should be scheduled at another time.


