Dear Parents,

With all of the preparations being made to reopen NDA for the 2020-21 school year, it has been a very busy summer. While we were ready to welcome our students back to campus on our original start date, we are following state and Diocesan guidelines and delaying our start to Monday, August 17. As Dr. Koehl and I said in our letter to you communicating that news last week, our school community is already learning to be flexible and adaptable this school year. I thank you for your support and understanding as we respond to the constantly changing situations presented by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Each year, I enjoy meeting our parents when they come to campus in early August for our Back to School Night presentations. In an effort to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, this year we have decided to deliver that presentation to our parents in a pre-recorded video. The grade level information that is typically presented on Back to School Night is not included in this video but will be communicated to you at a later date.

With less than two weeks until the first day of school, it is critically important that our school families follow all guidelines to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. We do not want anything to jeopardize our ability to follow Plan 1 of our Pandas Return to Campus Plan with a full return of all students to in person instruction with safety precautions in place. Please encourage your daughter to make good choices by wearing a mask, social distancing and limiting her exposure to COVID-19 by only attending gatherings of 10 people or less. We also ask that you do not travel to high risks areas where there is a COVID-19 positivity rate greater than 15%.

Please note: Families who choose to join school remotely while NDA follows Plan 1 must request remote learning for their daughter with a <u>Remote Learning Request Form</u> by this **Friday, August 7, 2020**. This decision will be reevaluated after the first two weeks of the school year and parents can then make a decision regarding in person or remote learning for their daughter for the remainder of the quarter. Families will be asked at the end of the first quarter what they would like to do for the 2nd quarter.

We appreciate the cooperation of our entire NDA community throughout these challenging times. As we move forward, please know that our goal is to protect the health and wellbeing of our students, faculty and staff while continuing to meet our responsibility to educate our students. Thank you for partnering with us in your daughter's Catholic education.





PARKING PASSES

Parking passes will go on sale for seniors this Friday starting at 7:00 a.m. All passes will be sold electronically requiring the use of a credit card for payment; passes for the year are \$25 each. All students purchasing a pass will be required to upload a picture of their valid driver's license for the school's records. Physical passes will be passed out on the first day of school during homeroom.

See <u>parking lot layout</u> to choose the spot you wish to purchase. Spots will be assigned on a first come, first serve basis. See the schedule below for all pertinent grade levels. Failure to follow the assigned schedule for grades will result in loss of spot as purchased out of order. In summary and in order to purchase a pass:

- Students will need to upload a picture of their valid driver's license in the form.
- A credit or debit card is required to purchase.
- Parking passes will be handed out the first day of school during homeroom.






Some helpful information about Orientation Day:
