## NDA STUDENTS NAMED NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS <

Four students from Notre Dame Academy have been named National Merit Semifinalists. NDA seniors, Andrea Davis, Carly Gross, Kelsey Sucher and Lily Thaman, were among the 16,000 Semifinalists named in the 61st annual National Merit Scholarship Program.

These academically talented high school seniors now have the opportunity to continue in the competition for some 7,400 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$32 million that will be offered next spring. To become finalists in the National Merit Scholarship Program these young wom-

en must now submit scholarship applications that include information about their academic records, co-curricular activities, leadership abilities, honors, awards and employment.

"We are extremely proud of these NDA scholars and their selection as National Merit Semifinalists," said Mr. Jack VonHandorf, Principal of Notre Dame Academy. "They are to be commended for their commitment to academic excellence and diligence in the classroom. We congratulate these young women and their families as we celebrate this honor."



## CONGRATS MORGAN!

Congratulations to NDA senior Morgan Hentz on being named LaRosa's MVP of the Week!

A four-year varsity starter and a volleyball All-American, Morgan is one of the top volleyball players in the nation in the class of 2016. An outside hitter/libero, Morgan last season led the Pandas to a 4th straight 9th region championship and a 2nd straight state runner-up finish.

Morgan recorded 304 kills, 253 digs, 52 blocks and 14 aces last season and was a PrepVolleyball.com finalist for National Junior Player of the Year.

She was named the Enquirer's NKY Player of the Year, Kentucky 9th Region Player of the Year and 1st team all-state. She was named to the all-tournament team of the Kentucky state championships and was MVP of the district and regional tournaments.

This summer, Morgan was named to the all-tournament team of the USA Volleyball girls' national championships in New Orleans. She also was one of 12 players representing Team USA at the FIVB Girls U-18 world championships in Peru.

Active in community service, Morgan earned first honors every quarter at NDA and is a National Honor Society student. She has committed to Stanford University.
