

GSP is a 5-week summer residential program for outstanding KY students after completing their 11th grade of high school. Established in 1983, the program provides academic and personal growth through a strong liberal arts program balanced with a full co-curricular and residential life experience while living on a KY college campus. Students complete an application and compete with others from across the state. The Program's mission is to enhance Kentucky's next generation of civic and economic leaders. Divorce groups meet once a week for 5 weeks each semester, and are scheduled on a rotating basis so that no one misses any class more than once a semester.
