Blessings friends,

We are off to a running start this school year. It's amazing how quickly we have all gotten back to our routines. I hope things went well for your daughters this first week of school.

We had our first Panda Parent Club meeting of the school year this past Monday. At the Diocesan senior mass this week, Bishop Foys awarded the seniors a day off on on Monday, September 18.



AP BIO STUDENTS GROW SCIENTIFIC SKILLS

As a part of their summer assignment, Ms. Proudfit's AP Biology students grew a plant of their choice from seed. Students wrote a plan for their plant's growth, taking into account the unique needs of the species that they chose. While growing the plant, students maintained field notes with both qualitative and quantitative data as well as photo documentation of their plant's growth and development. This exercise gave students practice working with living organisms, collecting data, and maintaining a lab notebook, all of which are important skills for biologists.



FUTURE SURGEONS?

Two NDA students, Bridget Wall and Madison McCauley were selected to be part of the M.O.O.N. (Medical / Observation / Opportunity / Network) program this summer through St. Elizabeth Healthcare. Over 80 students applied for the program but only 10 were chosen and 2 of them were from NDA! They spent 3 days shadowing a surgeon in the OR, office and hospital rounds. For the past twelve years, Dr. Ryan Moon has been developing this program. With tremendous support from administration at St. Elizabeth and about 30 physicians willing to participate, this was the first program of its kind at St. E's. It was a huge success and they hope to have a second group of students participate this winter. What an invaluable experience for anyone interested in a health career!

If your daughter is not already one of the 70% majority of our students enrolled in this club, please consider giving her this gift - and soon!

Loads of helpful information, program description, and Applications for Membership are available online at <u>Parent Page</u>: Drug Free Clubs, where you can also pay using an encrypted process. Cost to NDA students is \$25/year, due to NDA's subsidy of \$10 for each student membership. Freshman can pay for 3 years and have their Senior year membership at no cost! Applications will be accepted only through October 27.

Besides the rewards offered only to Drug Free Club members (weekly gift card giveaways, out-of-uniform days, hot beverages on winter mornings, free pizza, Prom tickets, etc), local businesses also offer <u>rewards</u>.

More food for thought:

- The vast majority of adults with a substance abuse disorder began drinking and using illicit drugs before the age of 18.
- Teens who consistently learn about the risks of drugs from their parents are up to 50% less likely to use drugs than those who don't.
- Teens who voluntarily choose to remain drug free in high school are more likely to continue to make these decisions and life choices in college, and beyond.

CAN YOU LEND A HELPING HAND?


