I understand that our students do not like to miss school however, please also encourage your daughter to be as truthful as possible in answering the Daily Symptom Check questions as we all need to do what is best for the health and safety of our entire community.

REVIEW OF DAILY SYMPTOM CHECK <

Colds, flus, sinus infections and other respiratory illnesses are more common in colder months which could lead to questions regarding related symptoms and our Daily Symptom Check. As we begin the season of fall with cooler temperatures in the forecast, please review the Daily Symptom Check questions as well as the additional notes posted below each one. If you have any questions regarding the Daily Symptom Check questions, please don't hesitate to contact NDA's School Nurse, Tina Sizemore, at <u>sizemoret@ndapandas.org</u>.

1. Have you been tested and tested positive for the virus that causes COVID-19 in the last 14 days?

This is an easy question to answer with no need for further explanation.

2. Do you have a temperature of 100.4 or greater, as measured by a reliable and accurate home thermometer?

Again, this is an easy question to answer with no need for further explanation.

3. Do you have any COVID-19 related symptoms, including persistent non-allergy related cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, chills, muscle pain not attributable to recent activity, sore throat, new rash, GI symptoms (i.e. vomiting or diarrhea), or new loss of taste or smell?

This can be a difficult question to answer if you are experiencing a symptom that could also be attributed to another illness such as a cold, flu, sinus infection or other respiratory illnesses. If you are experiencing any of the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, new rash, GI symptoms, fatigue or lethargy, **PLEASE ANSWER "YES" TO THIS QUESTION so that our school nurse can address your symptoms with you.** As we move into colder months, there are going to be some gray areas when you will need the advice of Mrs. Sizemore. She will address these individual circumstances on a case-by-case basis and help you make a decision for the health and safety of all involved.

4. Has anyone in your household been diagnosed with, tested for or showing symptoms of, COVID-19 in the last 14 days?

Again, this can be a difficult question to answer if you are trying to identify the nature of an illness on your own based on symptoms common to a cold, flu, sinus infection or other respiratory illnesses. If you or someone in your household is experiencing any of the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, new rash, Gl symptoms, fatigue or lethargy, **PLEASE ANSWER "YES" TO THIS QUESTION so that our school nurse can address your symptoms with you.** She will address these individual circumstances on a case-by-case basis in order to help you make a decision for the health and safety of all involved.

5. Have you been in close contact with someone diagnosed with COVID-19 or who has tested positive for the virus that causes COVID-19 in the last 14 days?

Please remember the definition of "Close Contact" from our COVID-19 response chart: within 6 feet of a positive case for 15 minutes or longer regardless of mask use.

6. Have you traveled outside of the United States or any high-risk locations, as defined by the Kentucky Department of Public Health travel advisory, in the last 14 days or been in close contact with someone who traveled to a high-risk location in the past 14 days? This is based upon states with a positivity testing rate at or above 15%. Have you traveled, in the last 14 days, via public transportation such as a plane or bus?

The "public transportation" directive is part of the "Diocese of Covington Department of Catholic Schools COVID-19 Return to School Requirements" that was updated on August 28, 2020. This was posted on the NDA website and sent to you in the Panda Press Weekly. **PLEASE NOTE: Mode of transportation applies to a plane, bus, subway, train or international travel outside the US.**

Last year NDA had 83% of students voluntarily participate in Drug Free Club. Why haven't you registered your daughter?

A: The cost of membership is \$25 (Notre Dame pays \$10 of the regular \$35 cost), which includes all kinds of rewards and prizes. Don't you want to reward your daughter for being drug-free? And for her to receive the same rewards her drug-free friends are receiving? Don't you desire her to have the associations and to be a known member of Drug Free Club? Don't you want your daughter to be able to list Drug Free Club membership on her college applications and resumes?

How to become a Drug Free Club member at NDA:

- 1. Apply and pay: Submit your one-page paper application and payment to the office or do it online <u>HERE</u>. The fee is \$25/year. If freshmen sign up for 3 years (\$75), their senior year is free.
- 2. Test drug free.
- 3. Receive your ID Card at school.
- 4. Enjoy rewards from school and from our local community!
- 5. Stay drug free! Random drug tests can come at any time.
