INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

In the next few issues of the Panda Press we will feature *The Technol*ogy *Evolution Series, a Senior Perspective*. Written by some of our NDA seniors, this is a series of descriptions illustrating how technology has changed at Notre Dame Academy during their four years here.

The Technology Evolution Series, a Senior Perspective Week Two: Katie Kloska '15

It's interesting to reflect on my seemingly stone-age years as a Freshman. I was confused as to why I needed to enroll in an InfoTech class. I already knew how to type over 60 wpm (words per minute) and could easily navigate through web browsers such as Safari and Mozilla FireFox; I was a self-proclaimed prodigy. However, I could only use my "impeccable" skills to research and type papers at home. Our education system's individualized use of technology was polarized. Either I would be completely immersed in technology during an InfoTech class, or would be taking stacks of paper notes in my traditional lecture classes.

It's important to clarify that the traditional, lecture enriched teaching method is very useful and effective. This setup allows students to learn in a structured environment while being given the opportunities to ask questions and make inferences. However, this teaching method has been clearly enhanced as I have advanced through high school. These enhancements have been made as a result of our administration's strong advocation for in-class technology usage. Now, with the students' corresponding iPad tablets and the teachers' new Apple TV's, traditional lecture classes can be enriched with easily accessible documents, photos, and videos. I have witnessed that classes become more enthusiastic when different medias are incorporated into the curriculum.

From my understanding of biology and human anatomy, as people are exposed to different types of media, whether it be visual, auditory, or both, the human brain must create new synapses in order to store this new information. Our student body has become well rounded in that we are able to access our curriculum through multiple different platforms. With our iPads, learning has never been more effective. Instead of practicing our skills only through attentively listening and taking notes, we are able to expand our skills through the former and participation in mixed media. For example, in my AP French IV class, Mme. Greife has integrated the use of French audio samples and news clips that are easily accessed through Notre Dame's universal learning platform, Canvas. With these clips at hand during class or at home, we are able to have constructive in-class discussions that have made my foreign language experience instructive and exciting.

It's easy to say that my years as a Freshman technology "prodigy" do not compete with the experience and knowledge I now have with technology. This ability to use technology has not only improved, it has innovated my method of learning. I am now able to visualize internally with ease and hear class topics that I would have had to "pick my brain" for as a Freshman. Now that it is 2015 and I am leaving for college soon, I can only be reminiscent and grateful for my years at the ever-limit-pushing frontier, Notre Dame Academy.

NDA LACROSSE


