TECH BITE FROM MRS. MULLEE IN THE DIGITAL LEARNING CENTER

The idea of being a good digital citizen becomes more important as schools start to adopt 1:1 initiatives, get more comfortable with students bringing in their own technology and use various technology as a part of the learning process. Where does this get taught? Who teaches it?

NDA recently adopted a program called:



The DDL project allows learners (whether they be students or teachers) to become immersed in the concepts that they need to be digital citizens. Cases are built and become accessible by the student as they take the practice and evaluative exercises to both facilitate and certify their knowledge. After researching many digital literacy programs, we felt the "Digital Driver's License" fit our needs as well as perfectly complementing our 1:1 iPad Initiative. In fact, DDL recently premiered as an App in the iTunes store that is now available in NDA's self-service app. This app is accessible by all iPad versions and the program itself is available online from any computer by going to idrivedigital.com. Students will be required to complete the DDL and we will receive an email from Mrs. Mullee with instructions on how to do this.

Notre Dame Academy recognizes the benefits of implementing Northern Kentucky's first 1:1 iPad initiative. The world becomes the classroom and collaboration takes on a whole new meaning for students, faculty, and staff. This year, all students must acquire a Digital Driver's License – an educational program administered by NDA's Instructional Technology department.

At the beginning of the year, students and parents signed an iPad Use Contract, which is aligned with the school's Technology Appropriate Use Policy. Students have been reminded via email of their responsibilities as digital citizens, and failure to fulfill these responsibilities will result in disciplinary action.

COUNSELING AND STUDENT SERVICES

The sophomores and juniors will be taking the PSAT on Wednesday, October 17. The students will take this preliminary SAT test in the school day and have partial classes after the test. The junior class takes the test to also qualify for the National Merit State Qualifying Test. Drug Free Club of America is a national school club that promotes and rewards healthy teen decisions. To join, students complete a registration form (available in the NDA school office), get a parent signature, and pay a \$35 fee. (Freshmen get their senior year FREE by signing up for all four years at once!) An outside agency will conduct drug screenings at our school during the week of Oct. 8-12. After testing negative for drugs on the initial test, students receive a Member ID Card with a number and can log in at www.drugfreeclub.com for numerous Community Rewards. NDA Drug Free Club members will also receive various NDA rewards: out-of-uniform days, treats, free mixer tickets, and random drawings for movie tickets, gift cards to restaurants, stores, Bambootique, and more! Drug free screenings will occur randomly during the school year, and re-tested members tested will receive recognition and rewards. Drug Free Club Members are eligible to enter the Scholarship Essay Contest in March and win a \$500 scholarship (NDA had a 2012 winner!) or other runner-up prizes. Membership in Drug Free Club, a credible, nationally known organization, can also be put on college applications! Register before October 8! FRUIT SALE

This **Friday, October 5** is the kick off for the fruit sale. Your daughter will be bringing home her packet of information and ten order forms.



FRUIT SALE INFORMATION Selling Time: October 5th – 26th



- 1. The fruit sale helps support the entire athletic program with no tuition money used for sports. If a student plays one sport she needs to sell at least **15 boxes**. If she plays two or more sports she needs to sell at least **20 boxes**. We hope that everyone does not stop there but continues to sell even more.
- 2. We sell fruit in 2/5 size boxes. The Florida citrus is delivered direct from the groves and the apples direct from the Washington State orchards.

We will replace any bad fruit until December 13, even one bad piece! Bring in the bad fruit and I will replace it.

These are approximate quantities in each box:

Red Grapefruit \$21 (about 18-20 pieces)
Tangelos \$21 (about 30-40 pieces)
Navels (seedless) \$23 (about 20-30 pieces)

Red Delicious Apples \$26 (40 pieces)

Gift/Mixed Box \$27 includes grapefruit (about 8), navels (about 8), & apples (about 12)

- 3. Fruit trucks will arrive at school December 7 for unloading with pickup and delivery to customers 12/8 & 12/9. Exchanges and additional purchases will be made until 12/13. All money is due by 12/14.
- 4. The girls are asked to fill out the order form using ballpoint pen pressing hard. Complete the forms including the full name, address, and phone number of the customer. Put in the **number of BOXES of fruit NOT PIECES** and the correct dollar amount and total amount of order.
- 5. They can hand in the white and yellow copies to Mrs. Schmidt who is in the foyer every morning 7:30 a.m. 8:00 a.m.
- 6. She has names of past customers if you have trouble selling the fruit. The girls can stop in the morning to get names.
- 7. The money does not have to be collected until the delivery of the fruit.
- 8. We ask that all parents and students work at least a 2-hour shift the weekend the fruit arrives.

Last year's sale netted \$70,000 for the athletic program. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and help with this project!





NDA OPEN HOUSE
