

NEWS FROM THE STUDENT LIFE OFFICE

According to the Student/Parent Handbook, cell phones "must be turned off and kept in a secure place, such as a backpack or purse. . . . COUNSELING AND STUDENT SERVICES

Red Ribbon Week: October 22-26

NDA will be participating in National Red Ribbon Week. This campaign focuses on awareness, prevention, and intolerance of the use of illegal substances. Led by our Teen Leadership Club, NDA's activities will include: wearing red ribbons in remembrance of those negatively affected by illegal substances, signing a Pledge to be Drug Free, sharing reasons to abstain from substances, displays describing different student-generated ways to say no, distribution of educational literature, and watching testimonies from people adversely affected by substance abuse.

Our Drug Free Club is still accepting new members. To join, fill out the registration brochure available in the school office, and place the completed application in the Drug Free Club box in the office. New members will be tested at the next random drug screening, and receive their membership cards after that.
