LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

As a former math teacher, I look at everything in life as a math equation and I understand that in order to gain the most, you have to know how to convert negatives into positives. I think we have been doing just that since we began school on August 17 - turning negatives into positives. Today we completed our 37th day of school which is roughly 21% of the 2020-21 school year. Although we have had to deal with the negatives of COVID-19, being able to have our students on campus for in person learning so far this school year is a positive in my book.

Our NDA community has worked very hard to make it possible for our students to attend in person learning and our Pandas Return to Campus Plan has been very successful so far this school year. That success is due to our students, faculty and staff who are committed to making good choices to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and seeking what is good for others. Our Pandas have definitely been *Uniting Humankind as Reflections of God's Love* this school year!

As we head into a 4-day weekend, I strongly encourage our NDA families to follow COVID-19 safety protocols. It is critically important that we stay focused on the common good and what science tells us about COVID-19: the best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus. Parents, we need your help to make this happen. **Please encourage your daughter to do the following over the long weekend so that we can continue in person learning at NDA:**

- Wash your hands thoroughly and often
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Social Distance by putting 6 feet of space between yourself and people who don't live in your household
- · Cover your mouth and nose with a mask when you are around others or you leave your home
- Avoid groups of more than 10 people
- DO NOT travel outside of the US or to any high-risk locations as defined by the KY Department of Public
 Health (states with a positivity testing rate at or above 15% you can find that list <u>HERE</u> under "Travel Advisory
 and you can find the Johns Hopkins complete list of states and positivity rates <u>HERE</u>.)
- DO NOT travel via public transportation such as a plane, bus, subway, train, etc.

PLEASE NOTE: STUDENTS WHO TRAVEL VIA PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION, TRAVEL OUTSIDE OF THE UNITED STATES OR TRAVEL TO ANY HIGH-RISK LOCATIONS (AS DEFINED BY THE KY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TRAVEL ADVISORY) WILL BE SUBJECT TO A 14-DAY QUARANTINE IN ORDER TO RETURN TO SCHOOL.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

PLEASE NOTE: There are specific directives from the Diocese of Covington regarding travel which you received in the September 2 issue to the PPW. These can be found on page 13 of the <u>Diocese of Covington Department of Catholic Schools COVID-19 Return to School Requirements</u>. Here are the directives:

SCHOOL NURSE

FAMILY TRIPS:

- According to the CDC, travel increases your chances of getting and spreading COVID-19. https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/travel-in-the-us.html
- To help keep our school communities safe, all families are discouraged from traveling to another country or state for family trips.
- Families must notify the school of trips that may increase student exposure to COVID-19.
- As a result of traveling, students may be subject to a 14 day quarantine in order to return to school. Considerations for this include the location, trip activities, and the mode of travel.
- Travel that meets any of the following criteria will require a mandatory 14 day quarantine:
 - Travel via public transportation such as plane or bus
 - Travel outside of the United States
 - Travel to the states listed under the Kentucky Department of Health travel advisory. This is based on states with a positivity testing rate at or above 15%. See latest data <u>HERE</u>.





IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR STUDENT ATHLETE PARENTS

Student Athlete Parents.

We are excited that we have been able to have fall sports so far and we are looking forward to our winter and spring seasons as well. Due to COVID-19 and all the uncertainty around athletics, we held off on our Coupon Book Fundraiser but now we are ready to get it started!

You will have **3 options** to choose from to fulfill the coupon book fundraiser requirement for student athletes. You will have the opportunity to:

- 1) Sell 18 books for one daughter, 14 books for a second daughter and 8 for a third daughter participating in athletics
- 2) Pay a fundraising fee and sell half of the books
- 3) Pay a fundraising fee and sell no books

For one daughter, the selling book option would be to sell 18 books. The half option would be a \$140 fundraiser fee and selling 9 books. The full fundraising fee and selling no books for one daughter would be a \$280 fundraising fee.

For a second daughter, the selling book option would be to sell 14 books. The half option would be a \$110 fundraising fee and selling 7 books. The no selling book option would be a fundraising fee of \$220.

For a third daughter, the selling book option would be to sell 8 books. The half option would be a \$65 fundraising fee and selling 4 books. The no selling book option would be a fundraising fee of \$130.

Select an option in Final Forms for each child participating in Athletics by **October 19, 2020.** If you have already selected an option in Final Forms, you can leave it or log in to Final Forms and edit prior to October 19. If no option is selected, or a student chooses to participate in athletics after October 19, 2020, the student will owe the "Sell No Books" cost.

If you are unsure whether your daughter plans to participate in athletics, you may want to select the "Sell No Books" options so that books are not produced for you and you are not held financially responsible for those printed books.

If you choose to sell any coupon books, pick up will be the week of November 16, 2020 with money and completed sales spreadsheet due January 8, 2021. There will be more information to follow about the spreadsheet and money turn in.

If you choose to pay a fundraiser fee, those fees will be billed to your FACTS account in January.



DRUG FREE CLUB

Why haven't you registered your daughter in Drug Free Clubs of America (DFCA) yet?

Q - My daughter may have used something, and I don't want her to get in trouble.

A - <u>The school NEVER gets the results of the drug tests.</u> DFCA informs parents directly, allowing them to handle the results and get any help as they best see fit.

This information came to parents last week with daughters in DFCA:

Most Popular Drug Trends Among High School Students:

- **1. Alcohol -** 58.5% of 12th graders report using alcohol at some point in their lifetime.
- **2. Illicit Drugs -** 47.4% of 12th graders report using illicit drugs at some point in their lifetime.
- **3. Vaping -** 45.6% of 12th graders report vaping at some point in their lifetime.
- **4. Marijuana -** 43.7% of 12th graders report using marijuana at some point in their lifetime.
- **5. Cigarettes -** 22.3% of 12th graders report smoking cigarettes at some point in their lifetime.
- **6. Prescription Drugs -** 14.6% of 12th graders report abusing prescription drugs at some point in their lifetime.
- **7. Smokeless Tobacco -** 9.8% of 12th graders report using smokeless tobacco at some point in their lifetime.
