

HALLOWEEN FESTIVITIES



- If you are auditioning to dance, you will need to attend the dance call on Nov 10.

You can audition for 1, 2, or all 3 aspects of the show (acting, singing, dancing.) If you are unable to prepare a memorized monologue or song, an option will be provided for you at the audition. We highly recommend preparing your memorized monologue and song in advance.


