

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

This is Red Ribbon Week at NDA which not only brings awareness and education of drug use to our students, but also encourages them to participate in drug prevention activities. I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that enrollment for NDA's Drug Free Club is open until this Friday, October 30. We have a very active Drug Free Club (DFC) at Notre Dame Academy and I highly encourage you to enroll your daughter in our Drug Free Club if you haven't already done so. You can find further information about how to sign up in the Counseling and Student Services section below.

As we head into another 4-day weekend and with Halloween on Saturday, I strongly encourage our NDA families to follow COVID-19 safety protocols. It is critically important that we stay focused on the common good and what science tells us about COVID-19: the best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus. Parents, we need your help to make this happen. Please encourage your daughter to follow COVID-19 mitigation strategies this weekend so that we can continue in person learning at NDA.

As you will see in the information from our school nurse on the next page, we have added a few updated documents from the Diocese. Please be sure to read the updates in these important documents. One section you might want to to review in light of any upcoming holiday travel you may be planning is in the <u>Diocese of Covington Department of Catholic Schools COVID-19</u>
<u>Return to School Requirements</u> "Family Trips" section (located on page 13). It states:

- According to the CDC, travel increases your chances of getting and spreading COVID-19. https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/travel-in-the-us.html
- To help keep our school communities safe, all families are discouraged from traveling to another country or state for family trips.
- Families must notify the school of trips that may increase student exposure to COVID-19.
- As a result of traveling, students may be subject to a 14 day quarantine in order to return to school. Considerations for this include the location, trip activities, and the mode of travel.
- Travel that meets any of the following criteria will require a mandatory 14 day quarantine:
 - Travel via public transportation such as plane or bus
 - · Travel outside of the United States
 - Travel to the states listed under the Kentucky Department of Health travel advisory. See latest list of states at: https://govstatus.egov.com/kycovid19




GSE has scheduled Virtual Learning Events this fall for prospective applicants and their families to showcase the GSE experience and dive into the application process:

ACT SCORES FROM DISTRICT OCT 6 ACT

Our seniors and some select juniors that took the ACT in school on October 6th may be discovering that they can see their scores in an already established MyACT account. If a student had not already taken the ACT on a national test date and had not set up an account, the student will not be able to set one up until she gets the paper score report for the test in the mail. I will be providing the students with directions about accessing the scores online if they have an account already or if they will need to wait until they get the paper copy in the mail. There are sometimes glitches int eh ACT system with be iign abe to access scores and students can email ACT with specific issues or questions. Here is is the information from ACT about accessing scores and how to contact them with questions:



Once the scoring process is completed, students will receive their scores in the mail, if they provided their correct mailing address during testing. Their scores will also be available in MyACT. Their mailed score report will contain a supplement providing them with information on how to create a MyACT account that will successfully link to their state testing scores, using their uniquely assigned ACT ID number included on their mailed report. If your students have trouble creating or accessing their scores, or if they created an account without using their ACT ID number, please have the students contact ACT Customer Care at httml for assistance.
