Dispel the darkness in our hearts and in our world.

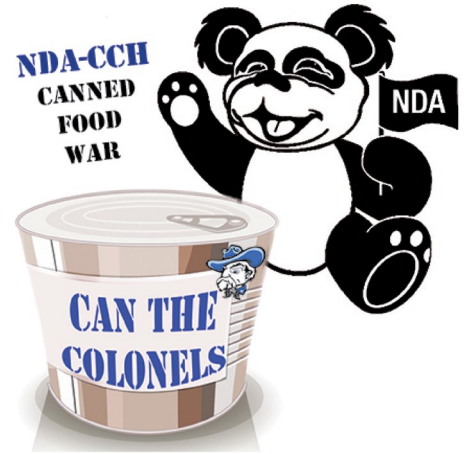
Let your Word ignite the hope the world needs

A.L.I.C.E. Training

Three years ago, Notre Dame Academy adopted the A.L.I.C.E. program, which replaces traditional lockdown procedures. The program defines response options and mentally prepares our school community to respond in ways that will increase chances of survival in violent shooter situations. Violent shooter situations such as the most recent occurrences in Arizona and Oregon remind us that school preparation is essential in maintaining a safe environment. The next training session for students will occur next week.
