

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL <

Dear Parents,

Although you may not have had the opportunity to celebrate Thanksgiving in your traditional way, I hope you and your family enjoyed a wonderful Thanksgiving break. This week we begin our Advent journey lighting the first candle, the "Prophecy Candle," of our Advent wreath. This is the candle of hope for Advent and it assures us that we can have hope that God will fulfill the prophecies declared in the Old Testament about Jesus. I have spoken to our students each day this week about hope in my live stream morning prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. I have challenged them to be bearers of hope to others and encouraged them to think about what gives life a deep meaning for them.


Advent reminder for students from Mrs. Price:

NDA SCIENCE TEACHER PUBLISHED IN NATIONAL JOURNAL <

We are blessed with an incredibly talented and dedicated faculty at NDA! An article written by NDA Science teacher Mrs. Molly Proudfit was recently published in the October edition of The American Biology Teacher, the journal for the National Association of Biology Teachers. The article is titled "Sorting Fact From Fiction: Media Literacy in the Biology Classroom" and was published under the Inquiry and Investigations category in the journal. In the article, Mrs. Proudfit proposes a lesson to help students develop media literacy skills, which are necessary across the curriculum and in students' everyday lives. In the first phase of the lesson, students are presented with a conspiracy theory (flat Earth theory, etc.) and construct media literacy questions to evaluate the claims. In the second phase of the lesson, students apply the questions they have constructed to a pseudoscience claim (climate change is not caused by human actions, fad diets, COVID myths, etc.). 




