

PARENTS & TEACHERS IN THE SCHOOL OF VIRTUE

September 23 and October 7 meet from 4-6:00 p.m. at St. Patrick in Taylor Mill. September 30 and October 28 meet from 2-4:00 p.m. at St. Patrick.

Description of the course:

This practical, hands-on course will allow parents and teachers to examine their view of parenthood, to understand it as a vocation essential to Church and society, and to see the teacher's role as an extension of the parent's vocation. Based on Father Edward J. Flanagan's Boys Town model for raising children to be responsible, productive, virtuous adults, this course will affirm parents as the primary educators of their children and give parents and teachers alike the tools to help children grow in virtue and good behavior. Fathers, mothers, and teachers are encouraged to attend. It is most beneficial for couples to attend together, if possible. Babysitting is available upon request.

Explain how and why parents are teachers of virtue

Identify prayer as the primary "tool" for parents

- Differentiate between authoritarian and authoritative discipline
- Identify that the first step toward growth in virtue is self-evaluation Describe the relationship between the virtue of prudence and the appropriate use of consequences and praise
- Demonstrate the steps in preventive teaching: developing moral virtues (justice, prudence, temperance, and fortitude) via social skills Demonstrate the steps in teaching self-control/self-mastery: calming down Describe the use of Family Meetings as a means of preventive
- teaching and teaching self-control Demonstrate the steps in corrective teaching involving the virtues of humility and obedience
