NDA Offers
Scholarships
to Future Pandas

Notre Dame Academy awarded over \$30,000 in academic scholarships to 20 incoming

freshmen for the fall of 2017 at NDA's High School Placement Test results meeting. Representing fourteen tri-state grade schools, these talented students earned the scholarships based on their outstanding performance on the High School Placement Test (HSPT) in December 2016.

Because of the generosity of the Sisters of Notre Dame and other benefactors, Notre Dame Academy awards several academic scholarships to the top performers of the HSPT each year. The scholarships range from \$2500-\$500. This year, NDA offered 6 renewable Academic Excellence Scholarships to students who scored in the 99, 98, and 97 percentile, and 20 benefactor scholarships based on academic performance.

NDA Students Named NATIONAL MERIT FINALISTS

Notre Dame Academy is pleased to announce that three students from the class of 2017 have been recognized as National Merit Finalists by the 2017 National Merit Scholarship Program. NDA seniors, Brooke Schulte, Paige Montfort and Abbie Guard have all earned the distinction of National Merit Finalist.

These students were among the 16,000 semifinalists named in the National Merit Scholarship Program's 62nd competition in September recognizing each state's top students. A total of 1.5 million high school juniors entered the program by taking the 2015 PSAT test. To become finalists in the National Merit Scholarship Program, these young women submitted scholarship applications that included information about their academic records, co-curricular activities, leadership abilities, honors, awards and employment.

"It is an incredible honor for three of our students to be recognized as National Merit Finalists," said Mr. Jack VonHandorf, Principal of Notre Dame Academy. "This accomplishment is a reflection of the diligence of our students and dedication of our faculty. We congratulate these young women and their families."

NDA Receives Record-Setting Number of WRITING AWARDS

The Notre Dame Academy English Department proudly announces that NDA's very talented young writers recently received 3 National Silver Keys, 27 Gold Keys, 67 Silver Keys and 60 Honorable Mentions in the Scholastic Art and Writing Competition. That is a total of 157 Scholastic Art and Writing Awards!

Hypha Fries, Claire Morgan and Lydia Watson were all named National Silver Medalists in the Scholastic Writing Competition. "It is an honor to work in a school that fosters and celebrates the creativity and talent of our student writers. As they continue to develop their voices, there is no doubt they can and will make a difference in the world," said NDA English teacher and English Department Chair Emily Sampson. She added, "Where there is art, there is light!"

21st Century LEARNING at NDA



Notre Dame Academy was well represented at this year's Tech Olympics in February. Two NDA students serve on the INTERalliance Leadership Council: Alenna Fletcher '18, is the NDA Chapter President and Angela Kyntchev '19, serves as the Outreach Chair. Both young ladies worked very hard with the staff of INTERalliance to make the weekend a success. Mrs. Mullee and juniors Jessica Beirl and Emma Nurre also represented NDA at the Tech Olympics.

Tech Olympics is the largest technology conference in the country for high school students. This conference gives local students the opportunity to explore new technology, compete school against school, sharpen their professionalism, and connect with industry leaders. Students attend various breakout sessions for a deep dive into a different technology topic, from IT Security presented by the CIA to Digital Design presented by local design experts. Competitions include the TopCoder Speed Programming Tournament, Hacker Heaven, Network Assembly Challenge, and many more. Further, students have the chance to speak with representatives from local universities to learn which choice of major best supports their IT career goals.

Science Research Students Dominate at SEFNK Competition



Notre Dame Academy science research students had an outstanding performance at the Science and Engineering Fair of Northern Kentucky (SEFNK) on Saturday, February 25. Each of the NDA students placed first in her category and qualified to compete at the Kentucky Science and Engineering Fair in April. Under the direction of Mrs. Terri Perrino and Mr.Patrick Strickley, Notre Dame Academy took the top high school award as well.

NDA Principal Mr. Jack Vonhandorf commented, "We are very proud of our students' hard work and dedication to their research. We are also happy to see their interest in the STEM fields. The winter sports awards program was held on March 21, bringing the season to an end for the teams of archery, basketball, bowling, swimming and diving. Congratulations to all of our Panda winter athletes on a great season!



The Panda Archers had great success this season. They placed 2nd in three tournaments this year: the NDA Classic, the Next Level Academy and the Twenhofel Shoot. As a team, they placed third at the NDA Charity Shoot hosted at NDA. In addition to their strong finish in the NDA Charity Shoot, they were able to raise \$3000 to support the National Wildlife Federation. Individual Archers showed tremendous skill this season. Erin Kirchner took 1st place at the NDA Charity Tournament and 2nd at the Next Level Academy Tournament. Hope Feinauer placed 2nd at the NDA Charity Tournament and Gray Middle School Tournament. Lily Gamel placed 4th at the Next Level Academy Tournament and Alexis Hehman placed 4th at the Ryle Haven Games.

NDA had many accomplishments during basketball season. Sommer Shields was named to the All-Tournament Team in the Freshman Pandamonium Christmas Tournament. The JV Basketball Team was a regional tournament semi-finalist. Varsity Basketball Panda Sophie Hagen was named to the Northern Kentucky Coaches Association Division I - First Team and Allison Gribben was named to the All-District Tournament Team.





The bowling team had several firsts this year. They were the Region 6 Runner-up thus becoming the first NDA bowling team to qualify for the state tournament. In addition to the team accomplishment, Alecia Radford became the first NDA bowler to qualify for the state singles tournament. Alecia scored big all season setting the NDA school record for a season average with a 162.55 and she set another NDA school record for High Series at 429. In the Regional Qualifier, Alecia Radford finished 3rd, Angela Huston finished 12th. Erica Huston finished 15th and Sam Wichmann finished 20th. Although the Pandas lost in the first round of the State tournament to the #2 seed Harrison County, they had a very accomplished season.



Congratulations to the NDA Aqua Pandas on another great season. The Pandas brought home their 19th consecutive Swimming and Diving Regional title. The team also won the Region 7 Sportsmanship award at this tournament. The Pandas excelled at state. Sophie Skinner won her 3rd state title in the 100 Yard Freestyle, her 4th title overall. Sam Glass won a state title for her time in the 200 yard individual medley. A new NDA school record was set in the 400 Freestyle Relay by swimmers Sophie Skinner, Allie Piccirillo, Samantha Glass, and Amanda Smith.
