NDA moved to its current location on Hilton Dive in 1964. Over the last 50+ years, the Park Hills campus has seen many changes including the addition of a Performing Arts Center, an outdoor sports facility and tennis courts in 2008. Now the focus is on updating the school building to keep up with the 21st century challenges and opportunities in education.

The *Excellence Without Boundaries* Capital Campaign program is the central component of the 2013-18 Strategic plan for NDA. The priorities of the plan represent key features of the holistic Catholic education that NDA provides: academic, spiritual and social/emotional development.

Currently construction centers around the enlargement of NDA's chapel. With its Catholic identity at the heart of a Notre Dame Academy education, the chapel has long been an important space within NDA's school building.

Along with the chapel renovations, NDA is creating a 21st Century Collaborative Learning Center. Notre Dame Academy has led the way in educational technology and STEM related fields. Educators at NDA believe that fundamental skills such as collaboration, communication, creativity and critical thinking are required for success in today's global community and they have integrated core competencies that have enabled students to thrive in the 21st century. Embracing the technological advances of our world is crucial to maintaining strong and successful education programs for our young women. NDA's 21st Century Collaborative Learning Center will truly support learning for all students – a major priority for NDA.

Next summer construction will begin in the school's cafeteria and auditorium creating a new Food Court and Student Commons space that will serve as a home away from home for students. It will provide an environment that is conducive to quiet study time and accommodate small or large group events as well as the entire NDA student body for assemblies and presentations.

NDA students very excited about the transformation of their school building. They appreciate the modern utility of the spaces which have already been finished and look forward to what is to come. NDA welcomes friends and alumnae to visit its campus to see the incredible innovative changes taking place and see first-hand - there is no doubt about it, it's a great day to be a Panda!




Women Making A Difference

Recognition Award Luncheon

Mary Brown has touched the lives of many over the years through her tireless dedication to serving others. She will be presented the Sister Reina Arlinghaus Award at the annual Women Making a Difference luncheon to be held on Thursday, March 8, 2018 at the Northern Kentucky Convention Center in Covington.

The Sister Reina Arlinghaus Award was created in 2010 to honor individuals or couples who exemplify the mission of Notre Dame Academy through their service, community involvement and philanthropic endeavors. Former recipients of the award are Robert Stevens, Richard and Jeanne-Marie Tapke, Bill and Sue Butler, and Sister Mary Rita Geoppinger, SND.

Mary Brown and her husband Bart have been residents of Ft. Thomas since 1966. They have 7 children, 19 grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren. Mary was elected to City Council in 1977 and served as a member of the Board of Council for 35 years. She served as Mayor Pro Tem for 2 terms, then was elected and sworn in as Mayor in 1999. After becoming Mayor, she joined in the River Cities Government Coalition of SouthBank Partners. Mary retired in 2014.

Mary graduated from St. Mary-of-the-Woods College, and is a member of St. Catherine of Siena Parish. Mary served on the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cincinnati United Way & Community Chest and the Northern Kentucky United Way Board. Mary has been involved in community activities and organizations for many years and in 1989, was named one of the Cincinnati Enquirer's "Women of the Year." She is a volunteer on the Ministry Team of St. Elizabeth Hospital, Fort Thomas. She served a nine year term on the Board of Trustees of St. Mary-of-the-Woods College and currently serves on the board of Trustees of Thomas More College.

National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).






EXCELLENCE in Teaching at NDA

NDA Community Inspired by Common Reader Experience



In the weeks leading up to the event, NDA's Introduction to Engineering and AP Physics students were busy running power tools and building catapults for the Pumpkin Chuck competition.



The Volleyball Pandas won the District and first two rounds of Regionals. They fell to St. Henry in 5 sets in the Region finals to wrap up the season. 
Soccer Wins Region Title for 7th Straight Year






Golden Girls Celebration


