Notre Dame Academy women continue to make a difference to their families, their communities, and the world in which they live. This fact was clearly brought to light once again as Rosa Hollis-Bird '62, Karen Bieger Finan '77, Julie Prewitt Schneider '84, and Julie Mullen Bruns '87 were honored at the eighteenth annual Women Making a Difference luncheon. Over four hundred alumnae, community and business leaders, family, and friends gathered on March 7 at the Northern Kentucky Convention Center to pay tribute to these Notre Dame Academy

graduates for their significant contributions and achievements.

Bishop Roger J. Foys, Bishop of Covington, began the luncheon with a prayer. Nancy Goeke, Director of Major Gifts and Events, recognized the Diamond and Platinum Corporate Sponsors, and Denise Bowman, Development Director, introduced the Women Making a Difference Service Grant. Kelly Kleier '11, recipient of the first Women Making a Difference Service Grant, explained how the grant was used to help with programming at the DCCH Center for Children and Families in Fort Mitchell. Dr. Laura Koehl and Mr. Jack VonHandorf then introduced each of the four WMAD award honorees.

Attendees at the luncheon came away with the renewed conviction that a Notre Dame education provides a strong ethic of service and dedication to others. The recipients consistently credited their dedication to serve to the education they received from the Sisters of Notre Dame and Notre Dame Academy.



NDA Offers Scholarships to Future Pandas

Notre Dame Academy offered \$48,500 in academic scholarships to 24 incoming freshmen for the fall of 2019 at NDA's

High School Placement Test Results Meeting. Representing 8 local grade schools, these talented students earned the scholarships based on their outstanding performance on the High School Placement Test (HSPT) in December 2018.

Due to the generosity of the Sisters of Notre Dame and other benefactors, Notre Dame Academy awards several academic scholarships to the top performers on the HSPT each year. The scholarships range from \$500-\$2500. This year, NDA offered 11 renewable Academic Excellence Scholarships to students who scored in the 99, 98, and 97 percentile, and 24 benefactor scholarships based on academic performance.



Mock Trial Team Makes History

On Sunday, March 4, Notre Dame Academy's Mock Trial A Team captured the 2019 state title making Kentucky Mock Trial history as the first all-girl team to win the State Championship. After placing first in the region, NDA's Mock Trial A Team moved on to the state competition where they defeated the defending state champions, Dixie Heights High School, and earned a trip to Nationals in Athens, Georgia in May. NDA's Mock Trial B Team also competed at the state level placing ninth.

When approached by students in the fall of 2015, faculty member and alumna Hillary Johnson '05, helped form NDA's first Mock Trial team as an extracurricular club. NDA alum and current practicing attorney, Katelyn (Conner) Mollet '08 answered the call to coach the team. Under Mollet's coaching and direction, that club has since evolved into a half-credit Law and Justice class introducing students to the legal system of the United States. While the class is moderated by Ms. Johnson, Mollett and her assistant coaches, Amy Hebbeler '09 and Emily (Cooney) Couch '10, both NDA alumnae and practicing attorneys, help prepare the students for Mock Trial competitions. They also explore with students the study of the basic social contracts of society enabling students to understand democratic values of justice, equality under the rule of law, responsibility, freedom, human rights, equity and human dignity.

"This class teaches our students to think on their feet," says Ms. Johnson. She adds, "Mock Trial students invest a tremendous amount of time into their case preparation. In doing so, they gain valuable critical thinking skills that they can then apply to all of their classes."

"In its short 4-year program existence, NDA's Mock Trial class has made extraordinary strides," says NDA Principal Mr. Jack VonHandorf. "I am impressed with the poise and professionalism of our students especially in the heat and intensity of Mock Trial competition. Our NDA community is very proud of their success and wishes them well at Nationals."

Notre Dame Academy's science research students took top honors at the Science and Engineering Fair of Northern Kentucky (SEFNK). Now in its 24th year, SEFNK was held Saturday, February 23, at Northern Kentucky University. In addition to winning the school award for most points amassed, Molly Kleier, Katherine Crail and Mary Roebker also won many individual category and special awards. All three students qualified to compete at the Kentucky Science and Engineering Fair in Richmond, Kentucky on March 30. Molly Kleier placed second in the Chemistry category at the state competition.

For the first time in Notre Dame Academy's short history of being involved in Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA), one-hundred percent of NDA's competitors qualified for the FBLA State Conference. Each NDA entry in the FBLA Region 4 Conference placed within the top 3 qualifying them for the state competition April 15-17 in Louisville, Kentucky.

These results are incredibly impressive with over 70% of NDA's members competing in the FBLA Conference for the first time. Furthermore, with an 87.5% membership increase, NDA earned the 1st Place award for 'Largest Chapter Increase - Small Division.'

Congratulations to NDA's very talented young writers who recently received 10 Gold Keys, 31 Silver Keys, and 45 Honorable Mentions for a total of 86 writing awards in the Scholastic Art and Writing Competition. All gold key winners moved on to the national competition. At the national level, three NDA students qualified as winners: Clara Dusing: Gold Medal - Poetry, Olivia Ossege: Gold Medal - Personal Essay/Memoir, and Bella Smith: Gold Medal - Poetry. These students will now have the opportunity to attend an awards ceremony in June in New York City to receive their awards.

Additional awards to note: Olivia Ossege was recognized as an American Voices nominee for one of her Gold Key pieces. American Voices nominees are "Best in Show" awards that most exemplify originality, technical skill, and the emergence of a personal voice or vision. Kate Williams received a Gold Key for her writing portfolio - a collection of several pieces of writing.

Congratulations also to our NDA English teachers represented: Michael Byrd, David Jackson, Gurrie Frisbie, Lauren Garrett and Amanda Schultz.

"We are blessed with a strong tradition of excellence in our English Department," said NDA Principal Mr. VonHandorf. "I congratulate our students and our faculty on their diligence and dedication to their work."

Making a Difference with **Green Dot Bystander Intervention Training**

Over the past two years, Notre Dame Academy students faculty and staff have been trained to be proactive bystanders through Green Dot Bystander Intervention training.

Recently, 32 students learned and practiced actionable solutions they can use in the potentially harmful situations of bullying, dating



violence and sexual assault. There was much enthusiasm and great discussion as students learned and practiced ways to keep everyone around them safe through use of the three "D" interventions: Direct, Delegate, and Distract.

Green Dot is a nationally recognized bystander strategy focused on preventing violence in all its forms. The strategy is based on the belief that each of us holds power as bystanders to actively prevent violence, and to shape our community's norms. The program teaches students that, "No one has to do everything, but everyone has to do something."

2019 Winter Sports Update

The winter sports awards program was held on March 12, bringing the season to an end for the teams of archery, basketball, bowling, swimming and diving. Congratulations to all of our Panda winter athletes on a great season!



NDA finished 42 out of 107 High Schools attending the NASP State Meet. The Team Score was 3292, only 16 points off the season's best of 3308. Only four other high schools in the region finished ahead of NDA. Madilyn Adamchik was the Outstanding NDA archer at the State Meet with a team high and season best score of 287.

Mary Frisk and Dani Shoemake both had season bests at the State meet, Gracie Seimer scored a personal best 280, joining the 280 Club and Senior Jenna Wigger matched her 10 meter only score of 283. Archery had 10 top 10 place finishes this year, 8 of those being in the top 5.

The basketball program compiled a total of 56 wins and 20 losses. The Freshman team won the NKY Freshman Regional Championship and finished the season undefeated with 18 wins. The Junior Varsity (18-7) advanced to the NKY Junior Varsity Regional Championship game but fell just short in a hard fought game against Highlands. The Varsity won 20 games and advanced to the 9th Region Tournament Semi-finals after winning the 35th District Championship. Danielle Rennekamp, the lone Senior, led the team in scoring with 14 points per game and was named to the NKY Coaches Association All-Division Team.





The 6 member bowling team had a great season finishing 9th at state and 2nd at Region. Annabele Wilson and Morgan Briede were two of the top ten bowlers in the 6th region which landed them on the 6th region All-Star team.

The Aqua Pandas wrapped up the 2018-2019 season at the KHSAA State Meet in February. Senior Allie Piccirillo led the team with two fourth place finishes in the 200 IM and 500 Free. Piccirillo was named to the Second Team All State. The team placed 9th overall. Prior to competing at the State Meet, the Aqua Pandas swam/dove their way to their 21st consecutive Regional Championship. The team took home 5 first place finishes: 200 IM (Piccirillo), 500 Free (Piccirillo), 200 Free Relay (Piccirillo, Maria Judy, Addyson Stansel, Anna Holt), 100 Back (Riley Jordan), and the 400 Free Relay (Piccirillo, Liza Muller, Allie Weidinger, Holt). Piccirllo was named the 2019 Swimmer of the Meet, broke 2 Regional Meet records, and an NDA Team Record. Riley Jordan was selected for the All Region Team. The Aqua Pandas also secured a Conference Championship at the NKAC Meet in January.

Notre Dame Academy inducted six new members to its Athletic Hall of Fame on Thursday, February 28. 
The new Mary, Mother of the World Chapel is a blending of the old and the new. Items from the original chapel built in 1963 include:





I love working and living in such a diverse culture, where the people are so generous. They are proud of their heritage and trying to preserve their culture of subsistence living, language, and dancing and drumming. More and more the Western way of life is taking over their young people and they are fighting for survival. My job is not easy but my husband and I think it is one of the best decisions we made to move to Alaska. I am hoping to retire in 2023 and then move back to the lower 48.


