The mission, vision and values of Notre Dame Academy are derived from the Educational Vision and Principles of the Sisters of Notre Dame (SND). That vision states;





Academics

The goal of NDA's Academic program is to educate young women who will use their God given intellectual abilities to make a difference in our world. NDA believes in an education that combines the timeless wisdom of our Catholic Faith with the necessary skills that its students will need to adapt to a continuously changing world. To that end, NDA offers a curriculum that will prepare each young woman for the many challenges that she will face in college and life.

NDA's highly qualified teachers demand excellence in the classroom and encourage each student to work to her full potential. With an approach that integrates academics, arts and athletics, Notre Dame Academy is molding young women to have a vibrant faith and a passion for learning.

Spiritual Life

Campus Ministry is responsible for providing opportunities for spiritual growth and reflection at NDA for students, faculty and staff, parents and the entire NDA community. Together with the Religion Department, Campus Ministry works to assist the NDA community to continue to grow in our Catholic faith through liturgy, religious education, Christian service and retreat experiences.

In our *Mary, Mother of the World* Chapel, students are able to develop a deeper relationship with God and share in prayer services and masses with one another. Our Reflection Space is a special place where students can go for quiet reflection or to pray and honor God.

Student Life

The life of a Notre Dame Academy student encompasses service, leadership, skill building and spirituality. Getting involved enables NDA students to find friends with similar interests and experiences, gain and exercise leadership skills and discover new passions and abilities.

Fine Arts

The Arts Department of Notre Dame Academy seeks to instill the wonder and beauty of creative expression in all of its students. Whether it is vocal or instrumental music, studio art and design, hand sewn quilts or theater productions, NDA believes that the arts enrich human life and explore the potential inside each one of us. At NDA, students have the opportunity to become involved in a variety of performing arts, including our renowned theatre and drama programs, a dance team, a choral club, our select choral ensemble, and concert and marching band. NDA's Art program offers a variety of courses designed to develop the creativity of the student through training in basic skills, and experiencing the use of a variety of art media.

Athletics

Notre Dame Academy has a rich tradition of success and excellence as an institution and in its athletic programs. NDA athletics is committed to developing student athletes and preparing them to make a positive difference in the world and takes pride in its academic success which is carried out in its approach to educational based athletics. NDA is a member of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association (KHSAA) and has won 32 state team championships, 75 individual state titles and has 40 state runner-up titles. The majority of NDA students participate in one or more of our 13 sports. Last year, 73% of NDA students participated in athletics and the average GPA of NDA student-athletes was a 4.03 GPA. Success at the high school level has enabled an average of 15 student-athletes per year to continue their sport at the collegiate level.



The Opportunity: Principal

Notre Dame Academy seeks a mission-driven, qualified professional to serve as the Principal directly reporting to the President of NDA to assume duties in July 2024. The Principal of Notre Dame Academy is a key leadership role and full-time position responsible for providing visionary leadership, fostering a culture of academic excellence and ensuring the holistic development of students in alignment with the school's mission and values.

The Principal's key areas of responsibility include but are not limited to:

- Overseeing the academic and spiritual formation of faculty, staff and students.
- Providing strategic direction and guidance in collaboration with the President and other key stakeholders to advance the mission and goals of NDA.
- Overseeing the day-to-day operations of the school, including curriculum development, faculty supervision and student affairs.
- Cultivating a supportive and inclusive school community that promotes spiritual growth, academic achievement and personal development.
- Establishing and maintaining effective communication channels with faculty, staff, students, parents and the broader community.
- Implementing policies and procedures to uphold the school's Catholic identity and ensure compliance with relevant regulations and accreditation standards.
- Leading efforts to recruit, retain and develop a diverse and talented faculty and staff committed to the school's mission.
- Collaborating with the President and other school leaders to help develop and manage the school's budget, fundraising initiatives and strategic initiatives.
- Serving as an ambassador for NDA, representing the school at events, meetings and conferences to promote its mission and achievements.
- · Share in the values of the SND Educational Vision and Principles.

Qualifications:

- · Practicing Catholic with a strong commitment to the teachings and values of the Catholic Church.
- · Genunine committment to the SND Charism.
- · Master's degree in educational leadership, administration, or a related field.
- · Minimum of five years of experience in educational leadership, preferably in a Catholic school setting.
- Demonstrated track record of successful leadership, strategic planning, and organizational management.
- · Excellent communication, interpersonal, and collaborative skills.
- · Ability to inspire and motivate others, build consensus, and lead change initiatives.
- Understanding of current trends and best practices in education, including technology integration, differentiated instruction, and assessment for learning.
- · Be able to build and maintain relationships of trust with all members of the school community.
