Student Services

Academic Growth

- Student class schedules have been shared on Powerschool
 - E-mail counselors@ndapandas.org with schedule issues
 - Schedule changes may only occur through the first two weeks of school
- Assist students with navigating through challenging classes, and help them develop skills to respectfully advocate for themselves
- Conduct and assist with standardized testing (CERT, PSAT, ACT)



Student Services

Social/Emotional Wellness

- School-wide initiatives to address holistic student wellness (Green Dot, Drug Free Club of America, HOPE Squad).
- Curricular and co-curricular programming are embedded to support students' emotional and social learning and health. Classes on relevant SEL topics are provided throughout the year.
- Provide support through various small groups and one-on-one counseling.

College/Career Readiness

- SCOIR platform is utilized for each grade level to explore college and career pathways.
- YouScience assessment helps student discover aptitude and career interests
- College Application Workshops: every senior will have started one application before their first day of school!

Cell Phone (PMD) Policy

Protocol:

From the first bell of the day starting at 8:00 a.m. until the last bell at 2:59 p.m., PMDs are to be turned off and stored in a student's backpack, bag or purse. **PMDs are to be out of sight and off.**

Any student found with their PMD out / in sight or on during the day without Main Office or Counseling Office permission will have the PMD confiscated by any school adult and turned over to Administration. The student may retrieve the phone at the end of the school day from the Main Office.

Non-Compliance:

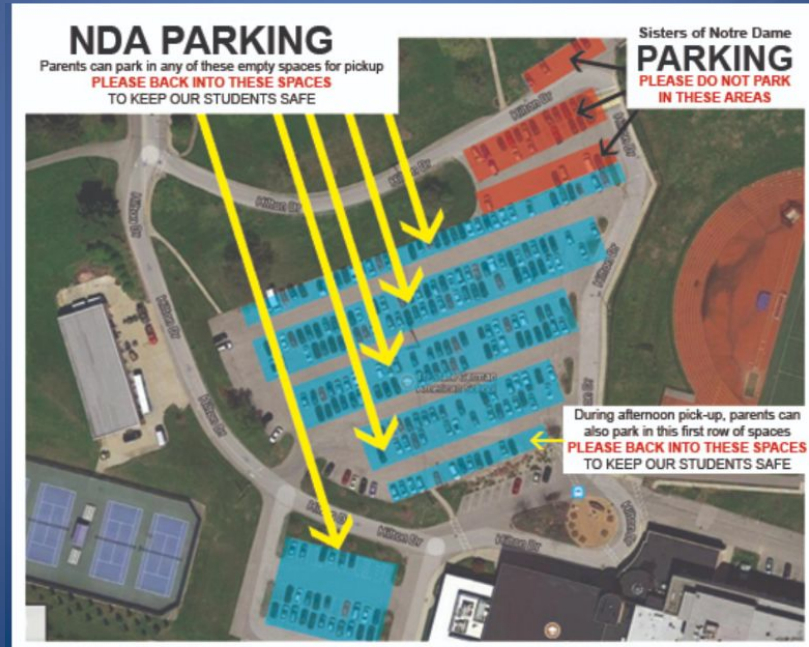
If a PMD is confiscated in violation of the policy's protocol, a student's management of the PMD would be altered pending administrative review of overall behavior history.

- 1st time: PMD will be turned into the office upon arrival at school every day for one week.
- 2nd time: PMD will be turned into the office upon arrival at school every day for one month.
- 3rd time: PMD will be turned into the office upon arrival at school every day for a semester and Saturday School will be assigned.
- 4th time: PMD will be turned into the office upon arrival at school every day indefinitely; a disciplinary and mental health plan will be discussed which could include in or out of school suspension and discussion of professional help to address the issue.
