A DAY IN THE LIFE

CELEBRATING 60 YEARS ON HILTON DRIVE

In 1992, the Disney feature film “Aladdin” opened in theaters inviting the public to take a ride on a magic carpet to see new sights and seek out new adventures. How apropos that song would have been in October of 1963, as 531 young ladies, 33 faculty members and 13 staff members turned from Dixie Highway onto the newly established Hilton Drive, crested the hill and caught their first sights of their new home at Notre Dame Academy.

The new building, “shining, shimmering, and splendid”, beckoned to them as they drove down the newly paved road. “A dazzling place they never knew” invited them to explore new worlds of academic adventures, social interactions, religious growth and personal journeys: “a whole new world, with new horizons to pursue”. (“A Whole New World”, lyrics by Tim Rice) Grounded firmly on the solid foundation instituted by Sr. Mary Agnetis in 1906, a new generation of high school students began their journey on Hilton Drive based on the same spirit that had been an integral force in all students who walked through the doors on 5th. As Sr. Agnetis was fond of saying, “A new Notre Dame? Never! A new building? Yes!”.

As the new home of Notre Dame Academy, the campus on Hilton Drive was designed to incorporate all of the most modern educational facilities needed to provide a first class learning environment for the young women who would walk through the doors every day: 17 standard classrooms decorated in bright colors, with a wall of windows on one side to allow for natural light; 3 fully equipped science labs; 2 modern business practice rooms; 3 home economic labs featuring dedicated spaces for food preparation, sewing and home management; facilities for athletic activities and studios for musical and artistic growth. However, continuing traditions from 5th Street would also be important. Thus, no matter which entrance you used to access the new building, a familiar statue of Mary, Our Mother still greeted each student, each faculty member, each alumna, each parent and every community guest.

Junior Kathy Gamm wrote of how the statue of Mother Mary helped to cross the bridge from old to new and bring the “spirit of Notre Dame” to its new residence. “In a way, this statue is very like the famous Notre Dame spirit. Its simple dignity is carried through in every detail. Each line of the statue is graceful in its simplicity, and in the same way, every aspect of our school spirit is esteemed for its unity. In another sense, however, this carving is very unlike our school spirit. As the years pass, Mary’s statue may lose some of its beauty and elegance, but that could never happen to our Notre Dame Academy spirit. This wonderful spirit which started on Fifth Street with only six girls in the first class, has been carried on there for more than 50 years, growing more wonderful with age. And now it will continue, although our address has changed to Hilton Drive in Park Hills. And this spirit will be passed on by our present students with a deep sense of simple dignity and love of Mary.” (The Gavel, November 1963)

During the summer of 1963, the 5th Street building had been emptied of all components needed to hold class. Desks, lab tables and cafeteria equipment had been sold, textbooks and supplies had been boxed and put into storage and student lockers had been dismantled. Although much anticipated by all members of the NDA community, unfortunately the new school building was not yet ready when the calendar turned to September 1963. A delayed start was unthinkable, so friends and students volunteered their services in order for the school year to open on time. Trips were made to the new school with boxes and articles that could be stored there so that the old classrooms could still be utilized. Folding chairs replaced desks, and “personalized” shopping bags replaced the locker for each student.

By September, the 5th Street classrooms had a decidedly “different look” than in the past, but everything was in readiness for the opening of school in the old building. When the school bell rang the morning of September 3, 1963, students could hardly wait to see what “school” would be like. The classrooms were furnished with chairs only; each student was given a shopping bag for her books. Because there were no facilities for lunch, the school day was split into two sessions: seniors and juniors met from 7:30 a.m. – 12:00 noon and freshmen and sophomores from 12:30-5:00 p.m., with classes scheduled for 30-minute periods. Everyone was most cooperative. Only the plumbing system acted worse than usual; so that when one student unsuccessfully tried to drink from the fountain, we heard her comment “Don’t tell me they’ve sold the water too!” On Friday, October 11, 1963, the last classes held on the 5th Street campus were dismissed for the “great exodus” to the new campus. A two-week home study period was declared in order to give the Sisters a chance to remove the remaining articles from 5th Street and to clean the new facility on Hilton Drive. “Cars, station wagons, small and large trucks were generously put at our disposal. Several Sisters took up ‘modified’ residence at the new school in order to be on the spot to receive deliveries and direct the unloading for various departments. Everything moved smoothly according to arrangements and the scheduling of morning-noon-and-night shifts. True, many of the workmen still on the job had to acquire a new skill – dodging the omnipresent Sisters. However, the men soon got used to us just as we got used to running into men just anywhere.” (SND Christmas letter, 1963)

Members of the SND congregation gathered together on the new campus the night of October 27th to celebrate the first Mass on the new campus. The next day all students arrived to begin their academic life on the new campus. After the distribution of schedules and homeroom assignments, Sr. Mary Immacula (principal) led the entire student body on a complete tour of the new building, followed by Holy Mass which was celebrated in the gym/auditorium. “There followed dismissal for the day, with a reminder that full sessions would carry them through an entire day beginning the next day and thereafter.” (SND Christmas Letter, 1963)

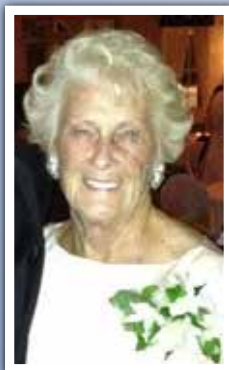
Women Making A Difference

NDA STUDENTS RECEIVE NATIONAL MERIT PROGRAM RECOGNITION



Notre Dame Academy is thrilled to announce that three of our accomplished seniors, Mia Kent, Clara Heberling and Lucy Bailey, have been named National Merit Semifinalists in the 2024 National Merit Scholarship Program. This prestigious recognition places them among the highest-achieving students in the nation.

Over 1.3 million juniors across approximately 21,000 high schools participated in the 2024 National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the 2022 PSAT. It is a rigorous competition that seeks to identify and honor the brightest young minds in the United States. To be named as a National Merit Semifinalist is a remarkable achievement in itself, as it represents an elite group, comprising less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors.

"We are very proud of the accomplishments of these three students," said NDA Principal Mr. Jack VonHandorf. "The selection of these young women as National Merit Semifinalist is evidence of their hard work and dedication to their education at Notre Dame Academy. The Freshman and Junior Varsity Volleyball Pandas ended their seasons in mid-October with records of 12-15 and 19-8, respectively. The Varsity Volleyball Pandas had a very successful regular season, including placing second at both the LIVT Tournament in Louisville and ASICS Challenge Tournament in Chicago where they competed against multiple nationally-ranked teams. They ended their season as the 35th District Champions, 9th Region Champions, and State Runner-Ups after falling to Assumption Saturday night in four sets. The Varsity squad finished with a final record of 33-6 and a national ranking of 22nd in the nation! A major highlight of the season was having a program sweep versus regional rival, St. Henry, at the annual Playing for a Purpose match! Congratulations to our Volleyball Pandas! Thank you for representing NDA so well!

NDA's Golf Pandas closed out an impressive season, with several standout performances. The hard work and dedication paid off as Didi Jiradamkerng not only secured a spot in the State tournament but also earned a spot in the prestigious All State Tournament. Joining her in the Girls Golf All-Region 7 first team were her fellow Pandas, further highlighting the team's achievements. This fall has been a testament to the talent and determination of Notre Dame Academy's golfers.



The 2023 Cross Country PaNDA's had a very successful and fun season! Summer practices were filled with fun themes like Hill Yeah Monday, Track Speed Tuesdays, Wayyy Long Wednesdays, Strength Through Prayer Thursdays where we attended mass after practice and Pacing to the Senior Theme Fridays. Our teams won the Panda Classic, Grant County, Southern Harrier Classic, Girls Night Out, JV Regionals and Freshman Regional meets. A notable finish was also fourth in the Midwest Catholic Championship in Cedarville, OH. Out of our 56 runners, 34 of them set individual person records! Notably, freshman Alex Burg ran the 8th fastest 5k time ever by a NDA runner with a time of 19:51 at the Midwest Catholic Championship. The average time of our top five runners was also the fastest average time since 2012. Senior team captain, Tess Lenihan, helped lead the girls and ran an amazing race at Regionals in Grant County finishing 2nd. It was their highest regional place since 2016! They wrapped up the year running State at the Horse Park as a team and finishing in 7th place. The future looks very bright for our running PaNDA's!

The Soccer Pandas have had a great season. All 3 teams won regional championships this fall! The Varsity team recently won the 35th district and 9th region tournament championships. The team finished the regular season with a 15-3-2 record and are headed to the KHSAA state tourney this week. We had several players recognized for their regular season performances. 1st team All region- Kimmie Woeste, Carly Tranter and Megan McGraw. Megan was also voted as the defensive player of the year for the 9th region. Kate Lenihan was awarded 2nd team and Hannah Renaker was voted to the 3rd team. The post season has been amazing so far. The soccer pandas won the district by beating Cov Latin and Beechwood. We turned around and won the 9th region by defeating some tough competition beating Conner and last year's 9th region winner Highlands. Congrats to Hannah Knapke for winning the 9th region tournament MVP. Knapke scored the game winning goal against Highlands with 38 seconds left in the match. At State, the Pandas faced off and won against George Rogers Clark High School and South Laurel but lost to Sacred Heart in the State Semi-Finals. 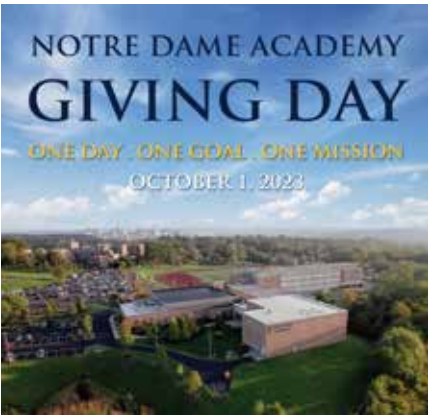

Linda Rue Hutchinson Class of 1983 - Founder/Owner: Rock Solid Families



Please describe Rock Solid Families.

Rock Solid Families is a faith based coaching organization that helps to strengthen individuals, couples, and families through the power of God and His Word. We meet with people face to face in our St. Leon, Indiana office as well as via Zoom from all over the country. We not only work with clients who are struggling or in crisis, but we also work on the preventative side as well writing and speaking on marriage, family, and faith topics through our workshops, classes, retreats, blogs, and our two weekly podcasts-The Rock Solid Families Podcast and Strong Dads.

What prompted you to start Rock Solid Families and how has it grown/changed since you started?

After working in the Indiana public schools for 32 years as a teacher, coach, and counselor, my husband was approaching retirement back in 2017 and praying for what God was calling him to next. During that same time a friend approached us and asked us if we could do anything in ministry, what would it be? And we both said families. For my husband, his passion was to encourage and even challenge dads to be all that God has called them to be and for me it's always been the young moms. We opened our office doors in Oct 2018 and since then have worked with over 1,100 different families and over 5,000 coaching sessions. Be careful what you pray for!

What are the biggest rewards and the biggest challenges to your business?

I would say our biggest rewards come when we see God do what only He can do. When we know that it is His power not ours. The greatest blessings come when we get to see marriages restored, families healed, and individuals set free from the pain and mistakes of their past. The biggest challenge is remembering that there is a Savior of the World, and his name is Jesus; it's not Linda. It's hard when the people you are working with choose to stay stuck in their pain, anger, unforgiveness, or hopelessness and not receive the free gifts of peace, joy, and love Jesus Christ offers to us all. That's when I have to remember Proverbs 3:5-6 and trust in His way and His timing. Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.

How did your time at NDA influence you and help you make Rock Solid Families a reality?

We believe that Jesus Christ is the ROCK on which our lives and families should be built. All other ground is sinking sand. Matthew 7:24-27. My parents knew the importance of that faith foundation and made great sacrifices for my brothers and me to get a quality Catholic education. Notre Dame Academy reinforced that same faith foundation and challenged me to do my own building. I will never forget my Senior religion class with Sr. Mary Lea and the personal relationship she taught us to have with our Heavenly Father through journaling and walks with the Lord. We want other individuals, couples, and families to experience that same intimacy with their Heavenly Father. And have a strong faith foundation. It's a legacy worth building on and continuing to the next generation.

What is the best advice you received throughout your business journey?

God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called. The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps. Proverbs 16:9. My husband and I had worked in the non-profit world our whole careers as teachers, coaches, and counselors, but we had never launched a non profit. We knew nothing about fundraising and running a 501c3 organization. It was a huge leap of faith and not one we took lightly. We both felt a profound calling on our lives that we just could not shake. My husband and I had been praying about the idea of a faith based organization for marriages and families for 7 years BEFORE our friend approached us to make it happen. I even feel adopting our youngest three children and experiencing the foster care system first hand was all part of his plan to equip us in working with under-resourced families.

Other information you would like to share regarding your entrepreneurial endeavors!

We also learned early on that when you are starting a new entrepreneurial endeavor, you have to surround yourself with people who have strengths you don't. You have to humble yourself and ask for help. We didn't have to know how to do everything, but we definitely had to connect with others who did. We knew how to coach and counsel people, but we didn't know how to run payroll or pay taxes. So we hired a bookkeeper who did. We knew how to teach classes and write curriculum but we didn't know how to market ourselves. So we connected with some great volunteers who offered to help. We knew how to lead workshops and write podcasts, but we weren't very good at the technology piece. So we connected with people who showed us how.

We are so grateful for the hundreds of families, businesses, churches, schools, and other non profits over the past five years who have come alongside our mission of strong and healthy families. We know it's God working through all of them to accomplish His goals. To God be all the glory!

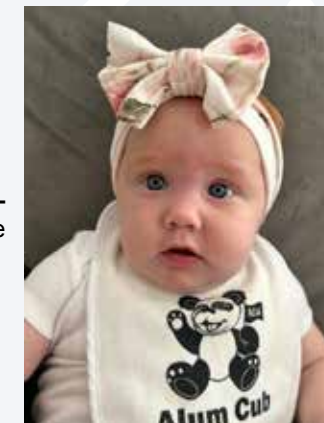

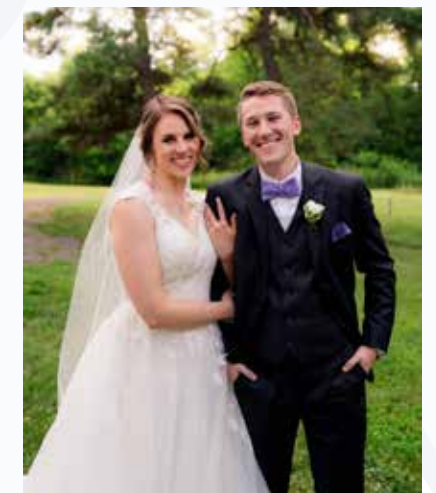
