Sr. Mary Ethel Selected for NCEA Honor

National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA), Sister Mary Ethel, one of six educators in the nation to be honored with this award in 2012-13, was recognized at a ceremony held in Houston on April 3. NDA Principal Dr. Laura Koehl, who attended the event with Sister, said of her: "She is far more than an educator and a physicist. Sr. Mary Ethel is a mentor and a shining example of a woman making a difference in our world."

According to the NCEA, this award

"honors Catholic secondary school educators who deserve national recognition, reflecting the richness and diversity of American Catholic education. Honorees are individuals who have made significant contributions in a variety of roles."

Sister Mary Ethel Parrott joined the faculty at Notre Dame Academy in 1972. She earned her bachelor's degree in physics at Thomas More College and completed a Master of Science in Physics at the University of Kentucky. Sisters Mary Ethel and Judith began an extracurricular Science Research Program at NDA in 1974 and developed it as a formal course for credit in 2007. The course focuses on conducting independent research project mathematics, natural science, engineering, or behavioral science. Students present their work and compete at various science expositions at the regional, state, national and international levels.




NDA's Science Research Students Continue to **Outshine Their Competition**

After another successful year for Notre Dame Academy's Science Research Program, three student researchers are moving on to national and international competitions. This year NDA Science Research students once again excelled at both the regional and state levels presenting their original and independent research projects.

Monica McFadden won the "Best of Fair" award at the Science and Engineering Fair of Northern Kentucky (SEFNK) on Saturday, February 23. Monica and Sr. Mary Ethel received an all-expenses-paid trip to the International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) that will take place in Phoenix from May 12-17 and include winners from approximately 60


countries. Notre Dame science research students had an outstanding performance at the regional competition including Laura Irons, who placed second at the fair, and many others who won category and special

Cassidy Ryan placed second at the Kentucky Junior Science and Humanities Symposium in Louisville on March 15 and 16. Szofia Komaromy-Hiller, Monica McFadden, and Cassidy were among the 21 students invited to present their original research at the symposium. Cassidy will next present her work at the National Junior Science and Humanities Symposium May 1-4. Besides the expenses-paid trip, Cassidy was offered a trustee's scholarship to the University of Louisville and a \$1500 scholarship to the college of her choice.



Most recently, Notre Dame science research students competed at the state level in the Kentucky Science and Engineering Fair in Richmond, Kentucky, Monica McFadden placed third overall and earned one of the spots to the International Science and Engineering Fair. Since she had already qualified through the regional fair, Emily Walter was awarded the regional slot and will also compete at the international event in Phoenix in May.

First place category awards were won at the state level by Cassidy Ryan in Environmental Sciences, Ellen Kendall in Microbiology, Emily Bautista in Earth and Space Science, and Monica McFadden in Environmental Management. Giannina Rokvic placed second in Energy and Transportation.



Emily Walter won a special award from the Navy; Josie Hammon's project was rated the best in geology by the Association of Women Geoscientists and the Kentucky Society of Professional Geologists; and Monica McFadden won special awards from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, Stockholm Junior Water Prize, and Ricoh Americas Sustainable Development Awards.

The continued success of NDA's science research students is a testament to the vision and dedication of Sr. Mary Ethel Parrott and Sr. Mary Judith Averbeck. These two young educators began Notre Dame's Science Research Program in 1974 as an extracurricular activity. In 2007, Sr. Mary Ethel developed the program into a formal for credit course. NDA's Science Research Program has inspired countless NDA alumnae who now work as scientists, physicians, engineers, and educators around the globe.


