

Every day I will strive to come closer to Notre Dame Academy by asking our Lord at Holy Mass to make me more Mary like, then I shall become a good Sister of Notre Dame."

Laura Dickman Koehl is a 1975 graduate of Notre Dame Academy. During her time at NDA, she was involved in the Thespians Club and served as president of the club her senior year. After graduating from NDA, Laura went on to receive her B.A. in Biology from Thomas More College, M.S. in Plant Ecology from Illinois State University and Ed.D. in Educational Foundations from the University of Cincinnati with a focus on science education for women.

In 2006, after 7 years in college admissions, 6 years as Vice President for Student Development and 3 years as Vice President for Enrollment and Strategic Planning, all at Thomas More College, Dr. Koehl returned to NDA as a science teacher. In 2010, Dr. Koehl became the first lay principal for the school and then in 2014, she became the first lay president of NDA.

Dear Alumnae, Parents and Friends of Notre Dame Academy,

With the recent announcement of NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl's new role as Executive Director of the Sisters of Notre Dame National Sponsorship and Network Office, Notre Dame Academy's Board of Directors has begun the process of searching for NDA's next president. In order to provide adequate time for a successful search, NDA's Board of Directors made the decision to move forward with an interim president for the 2021-22 school year. The Board of Directors is happy to announce that NDA's current principal, Mr. Jack VonHandorf, has graciously agreed to serve as interim president for the upcoming academic year. The Sisters of Notre Dame have approved his appointment which will be effective August 15, 2021. We have every confidence that Mr. VonHandorf, along with NDA's administrative leadership team, will effectively manage operations at Notre Dame Academy until a new president is named.

The Board of Directors has moved forward with the search for a permanent president of NDA who will assume the position of president sometime prior to July 2022. We recognize that the selection of the new president is one of the most important responsibilities of the Board of Directors. We realize that, in order to continue the outstanding work that Dr. Koehl has accomplished, we will need to search for an exceptional individual who is passionate about our mission and shares a love for our students.

The first action in the process was to identify and engage a search firm to assist us in this all-important task. In April, we selected Educational Directions of Portsmouth, Rhode Island, as our partner. Educational Directions was founded in 1987 and is a highly respected national firm. NDA's presidential search will be led by Mathew Heersche and Risa Oganesoff Heersche. Mr. Heersche and Mrs. Oganesoff Heersche are both leaders in Catholic education and as search professionals they bring deep experience, expertise and enthusiasm to our presidential search process. In addition, they have assisted a number of Sisters of Notre Dame educational institutions in the search for new leadership and are very familiar with the Sisters' charism, governance and leadership structures.

The Notre Dame Academy Board of Directors has established a Presidential Search Committee composed of representation from the Sisters of Notre Dame, NDA Board of Directors, faculty, staff and administration. Additionally, the Board of Directors invited Mr. Heersche and Mrs. Oganesoff Heersche to visit Notre Dame Academy in May to interview members of all stakeholder groups within the school (students, faculty/staff, parents, administrators, alumnae, board members). Members of the NDA community who were unable to attend one of the in-person sessions with Mr. Heersche and Mrs. Oganesoff Heersche were asked to share their thoughts through an online Presidential Search Survey.

We thank all those who took the time to participate in the interview sessions and/or the online survey. Your input is very valuable to the presidential search process and will be given much consideration. We will continue to keep all members of our school community informed on the progress of the presidential search via regular updates and all information pertaining to the search will be posted on the president search page on our website.

It is an exciting time for the Sisters of Notre Dame! One year ago, the Sisters of Notre Dame (SND) unified their four North American provinces to form SND USA. The new national province includes sisters from Covington, Kentucky; Chardon, Ohio; Toledo, Ohio and Thousands Oaks, California. Chardon serves as the national headquarters for SND USA.

In July of 2020, as the world was faced with the emergence of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19), plans were altered, objectives were adjusted and the lives of many were completely rearranged; however, the Sisters of Notre Dame held steadfast to their goal to combine their four provinces to form SND USA. The forward thinking SNDs began developing the transformation of their congregation in 2014 when they realized that their SND-sponsored institutions and ministries could be strengthened if they combined their efforts and resources nationwide into one SND USA province. After several years of careful planning, the Sisters of Notre Dame set the transition date for July 5, 2020. Little did they know at the time what the world would be experiencing in 2020; however, that did not prevent the SNDs from executing their plans.

The congregation's 500-plus sisters nationwide have combined resources and personnel to focus on three broad ministry initiatives:

- The education and healthcare institutions founded by the sisters in each geographic area
- Ministries serving new needs of people on margins
- Young adult and vocation ministries

The SND USA leadership team includes Sister Margaret Gorman, provincial, from Chardon; Sister Mary Shauna Bankemper, assistant provincial, from Covington; Sister Regina Marie Fisher, council member, from Toledo; Sister Patricia Mary Garrahan, council member, from Chardon; and Sister Mary Rebekah Kennedy, council member, from Thousand Oaks.

SND USA is part of the Sisters of Notre Dame international community spanning five continents, 14 time zones and 17 countries. Sisters of Notre Dame come from all walks of life, at various times of their lives, from different careers, cultures and collective experiences. Along with ministry expansions in the United States, SND-founded international missions continue to provide services in India, East Africa and Papua New Guinea.


CLASS OF 2021 TOP HONORS

She and her husband were instrumental in taking my mother in after Communist China had devastated the family and dispersed them. I found myself also tearing up as my mother cried that night. I felt more for her loss than the aunt I never met.



God gave us the Fourth Commandment to honor thy mother and father. It ranks above not killing someone and just under keeping holy the Sabbath day. Unfortunately, weekly mass attendance and our treatment of the elderly are a reflection of the times. Theologians would elaborate on the value of

family and respect for others in the Commandment, yet in its simplest sense, to me the commandment is just that - respect for the ones that brought you into this world. Everyone has a story to tell. Our Creator granted us all a unique experience. Whether that story is told and known to others is irrelevant. He knows. I just wanted people to know my mom's story. It's a story my children could only imagine in this day and age of technology and conveniences. It's a story of faith in hardship, a story of perseverance.

When the opportunity presented itself to benefit others and share my mom's story as an inspiration, I welcomed it. As I currently deal with my mom suffering from dementia and all that comes with it, there is much to reflect upon. It is quite a blessing that the tragic memories that haunted her are forgotten, but then slowly, so are the good ones. The days she looks through me and doesn't recognize me remind me that life is as fleeting as memories. I am thankful for the opportunity to honor her in this way.



NDA LAUNCHES NEW WEBSITE

After 14 months of planning, design and construction, Notre Dame Academy launched its new website in June of 2021. This marks the first major redesign of the school's website since 2012.



"The fresh and vibrant look and feel of the new site utilizes NDA's brand guidelines to create a more modern and visually appealing website," said NDA Chief Communications Officer Jane Kleier. "Through simplifying the number of pages and the navigation of the website, prospective students, current students, parents, alumnae and our board of directors will find this website even more user friendly than the previous one."

Kleier added that the website is a culmination of efforts between Notre Dame Academy, Systems Insight, Inc. and Intrinzic Brand Collaborative - a division of Graphic Village. This is not the first time NDA has partnered with Systems Insight and Intrinzic. In 2012, NDA reached out to Chris Fischer, an NDA parent and one of the owners of Systems Insight, to build a new website for the school. NDA also engaged NDA alumna Wendy Vonderhaar in the process to provide a new design for the school's website through the marketing company she founded, Intrinzic Design. The collaboration in 2012 was very successful and the website built by Systems Insight and designed by Intrinzic stood the test of time.

The website redesign tells the story of NDA in a visually compelling and dynamic way, helping to spread the mission of Notre Dame Academy. The new design also showcases the school's best features and improves the website experience for individuals both inside and outside of the NDA community.

"We hope that through ndapandas.org, prospective students will better understand what makes Notre Dame Academy unique and the opportunities available to them at NDA," said Kleier. "Visitors to the new website will experience the real impact of our Catholic identity woven throughout and come to understand what it means for NDA to be a school sponsored by the Sisters of Notre Dame."

I am convinced that through your efforts, the city, state, country and world will become a better place. The future is in your hands. Could it be possible that, one day, one of you is greeted as Madame President? Of course, with the Notre Dame Academy influence, nothing is impossible.




THE NOTRE DAMIAN | Summer 2021


