### From the President



### Dear Alumnae, Parents and Friends of Notre Dame Academy,

Greetings to you and your family. It is a pleasure to present the 2014 Fall/Winter issue of *The Notre Damian*. This issue serves as our annual report for the 2013-14 school year. It includes news of our alumnae, information about the success of our school year, and acknowledgements of the many generous donors who help make an NDA education possible to so many young women. Our school theme for 2013-14 was "Let us journey together in hope" - excerpted from the SND educational vision reflecting our deeply held belief in the value of working together as a faith filled community. In reading this issue, I hope you will find that our 2013-14 school year was a

very productive journey – filled with God's goodness and provident care.

We began this 2014-15 school year with grateful hearts embracing our new theme, "Celebrating Sisterhood." Our theme celebrates the Sisters of Notre Dame and the SND charism that makes NDA what it is today. It also celebrates the legacy of over 10,000 alumnae who use their SND education to make a difference in our world in so many ways. Everyday we embrace this theme in working together as a community of 579 students, 72 faculty and staff, and 533 families dedicated to the SND tradition of Catholic education.

We celebrate Malala as a young woman making a difference in a very significant way.

As you read through the *Notre Damian*, I invite you to celebrate our NDA sisterhood with us. I am very grateful for the opportunity to serve as the 3rd president of Notre Dame Academy and to all who make it such a hopeful journey. It is a humbling experience to witness the multiple ways in which our students, faculty, staff, parents, alumnae and friends support our mission to educate young women to make a difference. Our shared vision for NDA is that we will be a premier Catholic high school, providing excellent academic and co-curricular programs that prepare graduates to be outstanding female leaders serving our world. Our 2014 Women Making a Difference honorees (page 4) are living examples of this vision. 






# Celebrating Sisterhood A COMMON READER INITIATIVE

### I AM MALALA



The close bond shared by Notre Dame Academy students is a time-honored tradition that deserves to be recognized, so this year the NDA community is *Celebrating Sisterhood*. This theme has correlated very well with many activities and events of the 2014-15 school year, especially the inception of NDA's Common Reader Initiative.

"One book, one pen, one child, and one teacher can change the world."

In order to provide a shared academic conversation and an intellectual experience for NDA students, faculty, and staff, Notre Dame Academy implemented a Common Reader Initiative this school year. The objective of the program is to promote reading, critical thinking, and meaningful discussion. Beyond these goals, NDA hoped to foster integrated learning and encourage civic and service-learning activities. Though the aspirations for this Common Reader Initiative were high, the program was very successful reaching each of its goals and providing members of the NDA learning community with the camaraderie that transpires with a shared reading experience.

Before the start of school, students, faculty, and staff all had the summer reading assignment: *I Am Malala* by Malala Yousafzai. The story is that of young Malala Yousafzai, who spoke out when the Taliban took control of the Swat Valley in Pakistan. Malala refused to be silenced and fought for her right to an education. In retaliation, the Taliban sought to kill her. On October 9, 2012, a Taliban fighter boarded her school bus, asked, "Who is Malala?" and shot her in the head at point-blank range. Few expected her to survive. Malala's miraculous recovery has made her a global symbol of peaceful protest and, at the age of seventeen, the youngest Nobel Peace Prize winner in history.

On August 22, the NDA community celebrated Malala Day. A group of 35 students, faculty, and staff worked to plan this special day of discussion and activities relating to the story of Malala Yousafzai and celebrating the NDA Common Reader Initiative. The day began with a student assessment followed by group discussions and the viewing of Malala's address to the United Nations. Throughout the afternoon, learning sessions were presented on all sorts of interesting topics relating to the book, I Am Malala. One of these sessions was a presentation by Sr. Rita Geoppinger entitled Empowerment of Woman - Worldwide. Another session was the presentation of the Malala documentary Class is Dismissed in the Swat Valley - The Death of Female Education. Other learning sessions included:

- Basics of Muslim Spirituality and Prayer
- Understanding Pakistani Customs Regarding Women
- Malala's Father TED Talk and Discussion
- Letter Writing Session to Malala, Local & World Leaders
- Pakistani Food
- Pakistani Story/Mythology
- Pakistani Jewelry
- Awareness Art
- Pakistani Music Film

"This common reader initiative fully supports NDA's educational mission and vision as a school sponsored by the Sisters of Notre Dame, especially in exploring the story of a young woman's commitment to getting an education," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. "This shared experience has encouraged global awareness and critical thinking at NDA. It provides a real life example of a young woman making a difference in our world."

Though seemingly worlds away from her, every member of the Notre Dame Academy learning community can enjoy the opportunity to embrace Malala as a sister in mission, one who lives the value of educating women to make a difference.

### Students Learn the Dangers of Distracted Driving



On November 11, Notre Dame Academy hosted a Distracted Driver Program to show students the harsh reality of texting and driving and driving under the influence. Thanks to the generous support of St. Elizabeth Healthcare, NDA was able to bring this subsidiary of the National Save a Life Tour to its school community.

The Distracted Driver program began with a presentation which included a video showing the dangerous and sometimes fatal consequences of distracted driving. Juniors and seniors then had the opportunity to experience the hands-on portion of the program seated at a simulated driving test to experience what can happen with a distracted driver behind the wheel.

NDA parents were invited to attend a special presentation on the dangers of distracted driving that evening. In addition to the presentation, parents had the opportunity to get behind the wheel and experience the same simulated driving tests that students participated in earlier in the day.

"Texting and driving has become an increasingly large problem especially in regard to young drivers," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. "In bringing the Distracted Driver Program to our school community, we hope to educate not only our students but also our parents, faculty, and staff on the serious consequences of distracted driving."

# NDA STUDENTS RECEIVE NATIONAL MERIT RECOGNITION

Officials of National Merit Scholarship Corporation named NDA senior Hannah Ziegelmeyer a semifinalist in its 2015 competition. In earning the distinction of National Merit Semifinalist, Hannah is among the 16,000 semifinalists named in the National Merit Scholarship Program's 60th competition recognizing each state's top students. A total of 1.4 million high school juniors entered the program by taking the 2013 PSAT test.

To become a finalist in the National Merit Scholarship Program, Hannah must now submit a scholarship application that includes information about her academic records, co-curricular activities, leadership abilities, honors, awards, and employment. By doing so, she will have the opportunity to continue in the competition for some 7,600 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$33 million to be offered next spring.



Rachel Peavler and Lilly Morgan have been named Commended Students in the 2015 National Merit Scholarship Program. Although they will not continue in the 2015 competition for National Merit Scholarship awards, Commended Students placed among the top five percent of more than 1.5 million students who entered the 2015 competition by taking the 2013 Preliminary SAT/National Merit

Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).

"We are very proud of these NDA students and their recognition in the National Merit Program," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. "We congratulate each of these young women and their families as we celebrate these honors."



Notre Dame Academy senior Shannon Wilson battled brain cancer two years ago, and this fall she enlisted an army of NDA Pandas to keep up the fight. Shannon gathered over 250 friends and family members, most from the Notre Dame Academy community, to walk with her Sunday, October 26, in the University of Cincinnati Walk Ahead for a Brain Tumor Cure. The team called themselves the *Shannanagins*. Together they raised \$11,400 toward finding a cure for brain cancer. Far more

The project is very personal for Shannon. At the end of her freshman year at NDA, she was diagnosed with a brain tumor. In the summer of 2012, Shannon underwent a 13.5 hour surgery to save her life. "I believe that God woke me up from surgery for a reason," says Shannon. "It has been a very rocky two years, but I know it is my job to raise my voice and fight for an end to brain cancer." She adds, "For me, this difficult experience has turned into a source of strength and has given me a reason to fight for all of those who weren't as lucky as me to wake up on that June night."

"Shannon is an inspiration to all of us. Her fighting spirit and determination are absolutely amazing," says Notre Dame Academy President Dr. Laura Koehl. "We are proud of our NDA students. By supporting Shannon in this effort, they are living the mission of Notre Dame Academy and making a difference in the world."

Shannon and her Shannanigans were awarded first place for having the largest team at the event and second place for the amount of donations raised. The team's success relied not soley on the numbers that crisp fall morning but on the spirit of sisterhood that brought these Pandas together in support of one of their own.



Students at Notre Dame Academy claimed victory this year in the annual NDA/CCH Canned Food War. The NDA Pandas pulled out all of the stops collecting 14,468 canned goods. That is more than double the amount collected by the CCH Colonels.

While winning the canned food war and having the CCH boys come to NDA to clean up lunch for a day was a great incentive, it certainly was not the most important reward of this project. "The NDA/CCH Canned Food War was a great way for us to come together as a community and make a difference in the lives of others," said Claire Suetholz, NDA senior and Student Council Secretary. "It's amazing to think that between the our two schools we collected over 20,000 canned goods. That will go a long way in helping those in need this winter."

While the competition between these two schools is fierce, students at both Notre Dame Academy and Covington Catholic realize that everyone is a winner in this Canned Food War. "Seeing the massive amounts of canned goods and non-perishable food items piled up in the hallways of our school is a wonderful reminder of our students' commitment to serving others," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. "Students at both NDA and CCH can be proud of the work they have done to support our local agencies who provide food to those in need."

This annual battle began in 2010 when Student Council members from Notre Dame Academy wanted to do something to help fill the shelves of a local St. Vincent de Paul food pantry. They realized that if they challenged the boys at Covington Catholic to a Canned Food War, they could collect twice as many items for those in need. That year, NDA collected over 16,000 canned goods.

The war is over for this year and NDA students are thrilled with their victory and the thought of making a difference in the lives of others. The canned goods they collected will be distributed throughout the St. Vincent de Paul food pantries of Northern Kentucky.




