From the Principal







The 2015-16 school year was an incredible experience for our Notre Dame Academy community as we focused on living our stories of God's goodness. I am grateful to our faculty, staff, students and parents for welcoming me during my first year at NDA and for making the school year such a success. I wish our graduates the very best as they continue to live their stories of God's goodness making a difference in the world.

While summer is typically a time of rest and rejuvenation, many members of our community see it as an opportunity for travel, professional development and service to others. Several of our students recently returned from a trip to Central Europe where they visited Hungary, Austria, the Czech Republic and Germany. We also have a group of students participating in a mission trip to Peru this summer to paint and refurbish buildings, mentor children in English and bring their spirit of friendship to the community.

NDA science teacher Molly Proudfit is attending the CDC's Science Ambassador Program this summer. While she is there, she will work with CDC scientists to create lesson plans about epidemiology that apply best practices in STEM teaching pedagogy. The lessons will be published on the CDC's website for use in classrooms nationwide.

Also this summer, NDA social studies teacher Nancy Stratman is attending the 2016 Choices Leadership Institute on Global Refugees at Brown University to explore the complex issues of human rights, responsibilities and responses. While she is there she will examine instructional strategies for engaging students in the study of contested international issues, share best practices with other dedicated and innovative teachers, and develop plans for conducting effective professional development.

I continue to be impressed with our students and faculty and their enthusiasm for education. It is clear to me, and I hope to each of you, that as members of the NDA community we are part of a tradition larger than any one of us, a strong academic tradition of empowering young women to make a difference in the world.





CLASS OF 2016 TOP HONORS

The Panda Tennis Team members were the 2016 Regional Champions for the 21st consecutive year! This was a great team effort by all players to win this year, especially because the Pandas were not the favorite this year! The team went on to lose in the quarterfinals of the Team State Championships.

The doubles team of Francie Case and Kylie Moellering were Regional Doubles Champions, qualifying for the State Tournament. Their successful season earned them the 4 seed at the state tournament, which they proved to deserve. They lost in the semifinals to the #2 seed. Case and Moellering made the 2016 All-State Team!

Sister Mary Reina Arlinghaus 1917-2016

Our very dear Sister Mary Reina Arlinghaus, a humble mentor and beloved art teacher to many, passed away on Sunday, May 22, 2016 at age 98. She will be greatly missed at NDA.

Sister Mary Reina joined the Sisters of Notre Dame in 1940 and professed her first vows on August 12, 1943. In the 1940s, Sister served at St. Agnes in Fort Wright and Sacred Heart in Bellevue. She completed her B.A. in Art and Biology at Villa Madonna College in 1952 and her M.A. in Art at Notre Dame University in 1958.

Sr. Mary Reina went on to teach art at Notre Dame Academy in Park Hills for 54 years. After retirement, she volunteered at St. Michael School in Bellevue, Prince of Peace School in Covington, the Notre Dame Urban Education Center in Covington, and at the SND Provincial

House. Sister also dedicated herself to her ministry of prayer, remembering and praying for the needs of the world.

Sr. Mary Reina was a beacon of God's goodness to us all, especially those she greeted in hallways of NDA and led in morning prayer each weekday. She truly made a difference in the lives of so many including many NDA alumnae from years spanning a half century. May she rest in peace!

A Heart as Wide as the World...

A Recollection of Sister Mary Reina Arlinghaus from those who lived and worked with her.

The first recollection that surfaced among the five of us in the convent community at the academy was amazement at Sr. M. Reina's phenomenal memory. She recalled, for example, what her mother served the night before she entered the convent. Sister could pull up the names of women she had as students 30 or 40 years ago when she met them. What this demonstrates for us is her enormous capacity for relating to people. Her social calendar was impressive up until a few months before illness took her. Being with people, whether with community, family, or friends, was very life-giving for her.

If she was going out with a friend who had given her an item of clothing, Sr. M. Reina was sure to wear that item to please the friend. Pleasing people was always a goal for Sister. It is easy to see, especially given her warm personality, why her friends spanned ages. Whether the person she encountered was a high school student or an elder like herself, Sister always had the right words for that person. It is not surprising, then, that her mail included more cards in a month than most of us received in a year. Evenings were her time to make many phone contacts, not just with family members, but with many friends as well. Personal contacts were a priority with Sr. M. Reina.

A staff member recalled Sr. M. Reina's giving spirit that went out to anyone who seemed marginalized. For years she helped in numerous ways several people who were desperate for loving attention. Some of these people are in eternity now, so we can imagine that they were on the welcoming committee when Sister entered the Kingdom. It is no wonder then that so many people responded to her death as they did at her wake, her funeral, in sympathy cards to the Sisters, and on so many hits to the Facebook announcement of her death.

Her generosity seemed boundless at times. For years Sister went with Sr. M. Ethel to the science fairs at NKU in order to letter students' names and awards on certificates. This was no small feat, sometimes including over 300 certificates.

Sister was a great storyteller. Her long life gave her much to tell and she could put life into any recollection, regardless of how distant the date of it. Nor was not hard for her listeners to imagine the scene she was recalling.

Sister's furry friend was probably one of those on the reception committee on that fateful May 22nd. Surely Barney was strong in her affections and her memories after his demise. He was her guardian, her shadow, her friend, and she grieved for him as any people do who have lost a pet.

It is not far-fetched to say that the memories of Sr. M. Reina could fill a book. Sister had her faults as we all do, but any recollection of these is dimmed by the brightness of wonder of a life lived so completely and shiningly to the hilt.

The luncheon was a wonderful celebration of our seniors and the legacy of which they are now a part. Special thanks to Anne Smith Wolking '02 who spoke to the new members of NDA's Alumnae Association about the positive impact an NDA education has had on her life.

Following the luncheon, the NDA community bid farewell to the Class of 2016 and two legendary faculty members who are both graduates of Notre Dame Academy. Mrs. Linda Bricking is putting her red pen away after 35 years of teaching, 22 of which were at NDA. Mrs. Connie Roenker is also retiring this year after 33 years teaching at NDA. Both of these alumnae will be remembered as consummate educators, completely committed to educating young women to make a difference in the world.



NDA Alumna to be Inducted into Kentucky Aviation Hall of Fame

A 1993 gradute of Notre Dame Academy, Lt. Col. Amy McGrath Henderson USMC, USNA '97 and the first woman to fly the F/A-18 in combat during Operation Enduring Freedom for the US Marine Corps, will be inducted into the Kentucky Aviation Hall of Fame on November 12, 2016.

Amy loved history and quickly fell in love with military aviation. By the time she was in junior high, she knew she wanted to be a Navy or Marine Corps fighter pilot. At that time, women were not allowed to fly combat aircraft. At the age of 12, Amy wrote letters to all members of the Senate and House Armed Services Committee as well as her congressman urging them to change the law. Most of the responses, including from her congressman, were bleak, encouraging her not to pursue naval aviation.



That did not stop her. She earned an appointment to the US Naval Academy and in 1993, her first year there, Congress and the President ended the combat exclusion law. She graduated and was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant of Marines in 1997. She completed flight school in July 1999 and reported to MCAS Miramar as an F/A-18D Hornet Weapons Systems Officer. In 2002, Captain McGrath, call sign "Krusty," deployed to Kyrgyzstan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom where she flew over 50 combat missions in Afghanistan. In that theater of war, she became the first woman to fly in an F/A-18 in combat for the Marine Corps. In 2003, she deployed to Operation Iraqi Freedom. She flew another 30+ combat missions and dropped over 50,000 pounds of ordnance on enemy targets in Iraq. She deployed to Afghanistan in 2010 with 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing as the Deputy Future Operations Officer.

Major McGrath has accrued over 2000 flight hours (350 combat flight hours), has flown 85+ combat missions in both Afghanistan and Iraq. In 2011, Maj. McGrath moved to Washington D.C. for her assignment on Capitol Hill as a Congressional Fellow. She worked in the office of Rep. Susan Davis as the Congresswoman's defense and foreign affairs policy advisor. Following her fellowship, she served in the Pentagon at Headquarters Marine Corps, Strategy & Plans Division, International Affairs Branch as the Marine Corps' liaison to other federal government agencies such as the Department of State and USAID. Lieutenant Colonel McGrath is currently assigned as an instructor in the Political Science Department at the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD teaching the future officers of the Navy and Marine Corps.

Amy is married to Lieutenant Commander Erik Henderson. Amy and Erik have two sons, Teddy and George, and recently welcomed daughter, Ella to their family.

In memory of Christina, a permanently endowed scholarship fund has been established at the University of Cincinnati College of Allied Health Sciences. Donations to the fund can be made online.







