



While heavy spring storms prevented the May Crowning and groundbreaking ceremonies from being held outside as originally planned, no amount of rain could dampen the spirit of the occasion.

May Crowning has always been a very memorable annual event at Notre Dame Academy. Students, faculty, staff and administration come together each year to honor the school's patroness and reflect on Notre Dame Academy's educational mission as a school dedicated to Mary. This year NDA was honored to have Bishop Roger Foys preside at the ceremony.

As is the tradition at Notre Dame Academy, the privilege of crowning Mary went to a senior. All seniors are invited to submit a reflection about the Blessed Mother and how they have viewed her as a role model. Along with the campaign leadership team and NDA Board of Directors, those invited were Most Reverend Roger J. Foys, D.D., Bishop of Covington, Mr. Michael Clines, Superintendent of Schools at the Diocese of Covington, Sister Mary Ethel Parrot, SND, Provincial Sisters of Notre Dame Covington, Father Ryan Stenger, NDA Chaplain Father Michael Hennigan, NDA Board Chair Robert Hoffer, and Campaign Chairs Dr. Tony and Gerry Zembrodt and Gary and Gina Wulfeck.

"This is an exciting day in the history of Notre Dame Academy," Lisa said in her opening remarks. "Today we gather to celebrate and bless the expansion of the NDA campus and ask for blessings upon those involved in making this dream a reality." She added, "The future is bright for the mission of Notre Dame Academy and for all the future young women who will learn and grow in these wonderful new facilities."

NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl addressed the crowd saying, "Today, we officially announce the groundbreaking of this comprehensive project to secure the future of NDA. Since the founding of our school in 1906 by the Sisters of Notre Dame, we have continued to respond to the challenges and opportunities of the times."

For years, Notre Dame Academy has led the way in educational technology, integrating core competencies that enable students to thrive in the 21st century. As the only all-female college preparatory school in Northern Kentucky, Notre Dame Academy has demonstrated a strong commitment to academic excellence and empowering students by giving them immediate access to cutting-edge technology. At NDA, educators believe that fundamental skills such as collaboration, communication, creativity and critical thinking are required for success in today's global community.

Other speakers at the event included Sister Mary Ethel Parrot, Robert Hoffer, Michael Clines and Gerry Zembrodt who spoke directly to the students. "There will always be changes in NDA's future," she told them. "Someday you will be alumnae and you will have to step up to the plate to help keep the mission of NDA alive and thriving." She went on to say, "Am I just a little jealous that I didn't get to experience the 'awesomeness' of the 2017 NDA? Not at all! The mission of Notre Dame Academy was the same when I graduated in 1962 as it is today - educating women to make a difference. With Notre Dame, Our Lady, by our sides and in our hearts, we will make that difference!"

Phase One of the campaign began on May 30 and includes the renovation of NDA's chapel and the construction of a 21st Century Collaborative Learning Center. Phase Two of the program will include the construction of a Food Court and Student Commons and is scheduled to begin at the end of May in 2018.




Blessings Alumnae, Families, and Friends of NDA!





NDA Student Council Named NASC National Gold Council of Excellence



Notre Dame Academy's Student Council has been awarded with the highest honor of National Gold Council of Excellence. The National Council of Excellence is a national award program created by the National Association of Student Councils to recognize student councils that maintain strong year-round programs and work to improve their schools and communities through their leadership activities. This was the 5th consecutive year of competition for our Bass Fishing team. This year they faced the most challenging conditions to date. The Pandas were the only all female team to place and weigh in fish at the Kentucky State Championship tournament that had over 400 participants.

Signing a letter of intent was an exciting next step in life that each of the NDA athletes was prepared to take. Congratulations to the following student athletes:






NDA Welcomes New Alumnae Relations Coordinator




