





CHAMPION of EDUCATION

Each year the Northern Kentucky Chamber of Commerce Women's Initiative recognizes several deserving women who live, work or volunteer in Northern Kentucky and represent the extraordinary accomplishments of today's women. Several women within the Notre Dame Academy community were recognized at the 2019 Outstanding Women of Northern Kentucky (OWNKY) Awards including NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. At the luncheon, Dr. Koehl received the Helen Carroll Champion of Education Award for her impact and dedication to education in the NKY community.

Dr. Laura Koehl has been a leader in the field of higher education for 35 years including 29 years in Catholic education. Dr. Koehl first came to Notre Dame Academy as a member of the faculty in the Science Department from 2006-2010 and she later served as the first lay principal at NDA from 2010-2015. As principal, she initiated and implemented one-to-one computing for all students. Since 2014, Dr. Koehl has served as Notre Dame Academy's first lay president leading NDA as the chief executive officer of the school responsible for mission advancement, strategic planning, development, fundraising, finances, facilities and other related activities. She successfully led the Excellence Without Boundaries Capital Campaign generating 100% of the goal of \$7 million in 2018. Dr. Koehl has provided exemplary leadership throughout her tenure at NDA.

In addition to Dr. Koehl's remarkable professional achievements, she has contributed exceptional service to both her profession and the Northern Kentucky community. Moreover, Dr. Koehl is an incredible example to the young women and alumnae of Notre Dame Academy as an exemplary woman making a difference in the world. Dr. Koehl epitomizes the qualities of personal integrity, perseverance and leadership. She is a woman of character with the purposefulness and diligence to lead others to success. 






Marian Circle Commemorative Bricks and Celebratory Theatre Seats
