POMP & PANDEMIC STANCES

Notre Dame Academy's Class of 2020 will always be remembered for the challenges they faced with the emergence of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19). Its subsequent development into a global pandemic had a profound impact not only on the daily lives of NDA's senior class, but on the last months of their high school experience as well. Like many high school seniors across our country, NDA's Class of 2020 had an unexpected end to their time together as a class in mid-March.

On Friday, March 13, 2020, NDA students were gathered for an important announcement. Junior and senior classes assembled in the gymnasium where Mr. VonHandorf explained to the upperclasswomen that they would be transitioning to online classes beginning Tuesday, March 17. Everyone assumed that Remote Learning @ NDA was a temporary assignment but unfortunately it was not. The risk of COVID-19 outweighed the prospect of bringing NDA's seniors together again for the remainder of the school year.

NDA seniors lost their senior prom, Orange and White Game, academic and athletic signings, senior week activities, baccalaureate mass, senior breakfast and graduation. Spring athletes missed their final season and the opportunity to compete together as a team. Thespians lost their chance to lead the spring musical realizing that the show does not always go on. Most significantly, the Class of 2020 lost their last days together as Pandas. They no longer walked into school side by side each morning, hair tousled and backpacks in tow. Never again would they celebrate mass together, sing out loud at Friday lunch with each other or crowd into a booth in the CLC with their school friends.

While the losses of the Class of 2020 seemed immeasurable at times, NDA's seniors were "clothed with strength and dignity." They showed up each day for each class of non-traditional instruction. They worked hard and engaged in meaningful learning online. They were grateful for all that Notre Dame Academy faculty, staff and administrators were doing to preserve the NDA senior traditions that meant so much to them.

On Friday, April 24, seniors were allowed to come back to campus to pick up their caps and gowns. They were told to stay in their cars and drive through Marian Circle. All 126 seniors happily followed the rules to keep each other safe. They were beaming as they pulled over the top of Hilton Drive for the first time since that last normal school day in March. Faculty and staff members formed a pathway for the Class of 2020 to give them a wave hello and a masked smile. The drive through was such a success, NDA administrators planned three more of these special events including a first-ever drive through graduation.

On Friday, May 22, Notre Dame Academy pulled out all of the stops to celebrate its graduating seniors. As members of the Class of 2020 and their families arrived for their assigned graduation time slot, they were treated to the sounds of the school song, blue and gold balloons flying high and NDA's wonderful faculty and staff members lining Hilton Drive with signs of good wishes. After receiving their red roses, diplomas, and other graduation gifts, graduates went home to watch their prerecorded graduation ceremony. The virtual graduation was as close to a traditional Notre Dame Academy graduation as possible. From Dr. Koehl's welcome to Sr. Mary Ethel Parrott's sending forth, the program for NDA's 2020 graduation was identical to years past.

The prerecorded ceremony included the customary speeches. NDA Senior Class Co-Presidents Kate Joyce and Molly Kleier gave the Welcoming Address and senior Laura Nelter gave the Valedictorian Address. Mr. VonHandorf presented the graduates and then performed the Conferring of Diplomas as photos of each graduate in full graduation regalia appeared on the screen. Mr. VonHandorf also shared a few thoughts with the seniors in the ceremony as is his privilege as principal of NDA.

"Be confident - you have been well prepared academically. You have been empowered spiritually and you are equipped with a strong set of core values and beliefs. And of course, the most important lesson I would like to pass on to you that will carry you through your life - always remember to make great choices and go make a difference in the world!"

While graduation activities looked very different from years past, the sentiment was the same for the 2020 Pandas. The day was filled with an abundance of smiles along with a few tears. The Class of 2020 may have lost the last nine weeks of a regular high school experience due to COVID-19 but there are some things even a global pandemic cannot take away - the NDA spirit. Notre Dame Academy's Class of 2020 did not allow coronavirus to steal this special celebration from them or stop them from saying goodbye to their teachers and administrators. They did what NDA Pandas are prepared to do - they persevered and made the best of a difficult situation.

The young women of NDA's Class of 2020 have learned so many important life lessons in their last nine weeks of high school, lessons that often take a lifetime for others to grasp. They discovered perspective. They found out what means the most to them and more importantly, who means the most to them. Notre Dame Academy will miss the young women of the Class of 2020 - every single one of them. The NDA community cannot wait to see the incredible differences these wise young women will make in the future.

Look out world! NDA's Class of 2020 is coming and they are ready to make a difference!

At Notre Dame Academy, this medal is recognized as the highest honor and is usually the last award presented at the final assembly.

The names of the awardees are recorded each year in a book at the SND international headquarters in Rome. It is placed on an altar dedicated to Sister Maria Aloysia, an outstanding educator who founded the Sisters of Notre Dame in Coesfeld, Germany. Graduates are welcome to view the book if they have the good fortune to visit Rome.


Annual Fund Deemed a Success

NDA's Family Tree Honors Generations of Graduates


