

WEEKLY UPDATE

COVID-19

As of today, Wednesday, January 5, we have had 25 new reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. We have had 3 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19.

HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Dear Parents,

As you can see in the data above, we are experiencing the highest incidence of COVID-19 infections at NDA since the beginning of the pandemic. It is critical to our goal of continuing in-person instruction at NDA that parents and students communicate any COVID-19 related issues involving your family to our office. While we could not have anticipated the current COVID-19 infection rate and testing issues, we are doing our very best to follow COVID-19 mitigation protocols that will keep our students healthy and safe while continuing to experience in-person learning.

DAILY ASSESSMENT: Before students report to school each day, a daily health assessment should be conducted. Any student who is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 should not come to school and contact their doctor and our school office (859-292-1821). If your daughter is experiencing an illness other than COVID-19, please keep her at home until she is fever free for 24 hours and she feels well enough to return to school.

CLOSE CONTACT and POSITIVE COVID-19 TEST: In the event that your daughter is exposed to COVID-19, please contact our school nurses at 859.292.1843 or ndanurse@ndapandas.org. We will continue to follow the Diocesan COVID-19 Return to School Requirements for the 2021-22 School Year. **PLEASE NOTE:** The best way to combat COVID-19 is by getting vaccinated. If your daughter is 16 or older and was vaccinated more than 6 months ago, she will also need to get the COVID-19 booster to be fully protected. The FDA has expanded emergency use for the Pfizer booster for 12-15 year olds and it is anticipated that the CDC will approve the Pfizer booster for 12-15 year olds very soon. Please keep in touch with your pediatrician about best practice for protecting your daughter from COVID-19.

MASKING AT SCHOOL: As per the updated *Diocesan COVID-19 Return to School Requirements*, we will determine the upcoming week's masking status based on the data released by the Kentucky Department of Public Health (KDPH) on Thursday of each week. If Kenton County is designated as High Community Transmission (Red Zone) by the KDPH, NDA will require masks beginning the following Monday for 7 days. If NDA has 5 COVID-19 cases with increasing illness at NDA, regardless of the KDPH transmission designation, NDA will implement a mask requirement until case activity decreases. Currently Kenton County is in the **RED ZONE** at 128.1 - High Community Transmission (>25+ per 100K), therefore MASKS ARE REQUIRED AT NDA January 3 - 9, 2022.


