The activity encouraged thoughtful discussion, problem-solving and preparedness, helping our girls practice making sound decisions in a variety of situations. We are grateful to our faculty and staff for guiding these conversations and supporting ongoing safety review for our students.

For the 2025-26 school year, NDA provided \$944,297 in financial assistance and tuition allowances, demonstrating our strong commitment to accessibility and our continued efforts to keep tuition increases to a minimum without sacrificing quality or opportunity.

To better serve our families and provide award decisions earlier in the enrollment process, we have moved this year's application deadline to February 28, 2026.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION UNIFORM SKIRT REMINDER



We appreciate the improvement we are beginning to see as students work to take greater pride in their uniforms and in representing Notre Dame Academy well. While progress has been made, we still have a long way to go in ensuring that uniform skirts are consistently in compliance with our dress code policy.

Rolling skirts or leaving hems unadjusted continues to be an issue, and we are asking for parent support in helping us address this.
