


UPCOMING EVENTS CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK CELEBRATIONS!


ALL ARE WELCOME PARKING LOT REMINDERS



Winter Sports Recap

Archery -

The Panda Archery team began practicing on November 7. The team is composed of 32 archers. Thus far this season the team has competed in 6 tournaments - Ryle High School, NDA, Twenhofel Middle School, Cooper High School, Covington Catholic and Villa Madonna. There are 10 additional tournaments on this year's schedule which will conclude in March at the Kentucky NASP State Tournament in Louisville. The Annual NDA Panda Tournament held in December was again a great success; welcoming 505 archers representing 26 schools from Northern Kentucky, Louisville and West Virginia.

Additional Archery News: The Archery Pandas competed in the Villa Madonna Tournament last weekend. The team shot a season high score of 3008 which included 110 tens. The Pandas were led by Ava Boertlein at 271, Morgan Russell at 270, Reagan Carman at 263, Lucy Siegert at 259 and Lea Youtsey at 259. Next up for the Pandas is this weekend at the Community Christian 3D Tournament. Also, Ava Boertlein was 5th high school girl and Morgan Russell was 6th high school girl. ARCHERY PANDAS ROCK!

Bowling -

This being our second year in NKAC has gone quite well. We ended up with 11 roster players, 9 sophomores, 1 freshman and an 8th grader from St. Agnes. NDA practices on wednesday at Erlanger Strike and Spares with everyone learning and getting better each week. The coach was able to get everyone their own bowling balls which has been a big factor for them improving each week. The young ladies are very competitive which shows during our weekly matches against our conference high schools. They have been able to secure a couple of conference wins with the girls bowling their highest games so far.

The team has entered into 5 tournaments, 2 of which were in Ohio. During the team's most recent tournament Freshman Haley Pelstring captured the number 1 all tournament team in a field of approximately 180 girls bowlers from across Ohio.

Regionals are scheduled for the 18th and the 20th where they are preparing for a bid to go to the state tournament in Louisville.

Additional Bowling News: Recently, in a match against Cooper High School, Cami Noris bowled her highest game so far with a 182 along with a 165. Ella Webster's new high game of 133 and Linda Frances' high game of a 138.

Winter Sports Recap Continued

Basketball -

The Varsity basketball team is currently 12-2 & ranked 9th the State media rankings. Team Defense has been a major strength as the Pandas allow just 38 points per game & ranks 17th in the state in Team Defense. Sophia Gibson leads the Pandas in scoring with 13 points per game & rebounding at 9 per game. Maya Lawrie leads the team in assists with 6 per game. Emma Holtzapfel leads the team in 3-Point Field Goal at 38% while averaging 10 points per game.

The Junior Varsity team is currently undefeated with 5 wins while the Freshman team has won 7 games and lost 2. Both will begin Regional Tournament play this month.

Swimming -

The Notre Dame Academy AquaPandas started the season by winning both the Boone-Conner Sprint Meet and Flying Turkey Invitational. Their first meet at the newly opened Kenton County Aquatics Center at Scott HS resulted in winning the Nicole Tucker Invite hosted by Dixie Heights HS. On January 6, the team hosted 16 Catholic high schools from Greater Cincinnati and the Commonwealth of Kentucky (roughly 325 swimmers) at Keating Natatorium (St. Xavier HS) in the inaugural NDA Catholic Invitational. The team finished 3rd overall! The weekend of January 13-14, the team will travel to Baltimore, MD to represent NDA in the National Catholic Championships at Loyola University Maryland.

The post season begins on February 2, as the AquaPandas look to defend their Regional title and culminates with the State meet on February 24 at Lancaster Aquatic Center at the University of Kentucky.

Additional Swimming News: NDA hosted the first annual Catholic Invitational at Keating Natatorium on January 6. The AquapaNDAs honored their seniors and placed 3rd overall out of 11 teams. Friday, they will travel to Baltimore to compete in the National Catholic Invitational at Loyola. Go Pandas!

Diving -

Savannah Bien has placed 2 or 3 in each of the 5 meets so far this season. Each diver has learned new dives and will be able to enter the maximum number of divers (4) for the regional meet since each dive has the required 11 dives.


