
Thank you for your continued cooperation. It is a privilege to partner with you in your daughter's Catholic education.

WEEKLY UPDATE

As of today, Wednesday, January 12, we have had 43 new reported cases of members of our community testing positive for COVID-19 within the last week. We have had 9 additional members of our community who are currently in quarantine due to a reported exposure to COVID-19.

FROM THE SCHOOL NURSES BEST PRACTICE

Dear Parents,

As you can see in the data above, we have a record number of COVID-19 infections at NDA again this week. Thank you for your cooperation as we work though the process of each positive case. Communication is key to our success in keeping our students safe.

With the continuing rise in COVID-19 positivity rates around the world, it is critical that we follow best practice in battling this disease. At NDA, we follow strict mitigation protocols to keep our community safe and our building clean. Those practices are important however, as was mentioned last week in our letter, the best way to combat COVID-19 is by getting vaccinated and keeping up-to-date with boosters.

If your daughter is 16 or older and was vaccinated more than 6 months ago, she will also need to get the COVID-19 booster to be fully protected. If your daughter is under the age of 16, she is now able to receive the Pfizer-BioNTech CO-VID-19 booster shot at least 5 months after completing her Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 primary series. Research shows that vaccines and boosters have become critical tools in keeping us safe from COVID-19 serious illness. The other added benefit of your daughter being fully vaccinated and up-to-date with a COVID-19 booster is that she will not need to quarantine if she is exposed to COVID-19 at school, at home or outside of school and home. Please talk to your pediatrician about best practice for protecting your daughter from COVID-19.

PARENTS, please check your daughter's lunch account and to pay overdue balance as soon as possible.



GREAT OPPORTUNITY REGIONAL YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Applications for Regional Youth Leadership (RYL) Class of 2023 are now open to current high school sophomores. RYL is leadership development program for high school students during their junior year. Approximately 45 students will be selected to participate in monthly sessions examining topics such as arts & culture, economic development, local government, and more.

The program will run from September 2022 through March 2023 with monthly sessions occurring during the school day. Each session is held at a different business or organization throughout the region and led by community and business leaders. Applications are accepted from students attending private, public, or home schools.

Eligibility – Applicants must:

- be a current high school sophomore with a minimum GPA of 3.0.
- demonstrate leadership potential in their school and/or community.
- have an interest in furthering their knowledge about our region and community leadership.
- receive approval by guidance counselor or other school official.

Application Requirements:

- Complete the RYL application found at <u>www.nkychamber.com/ryl</u> by March 1, 2022. Applicants may choose to submit their application online or by downloading the paper application in MS Word.
- Obtain approval from one parent/guardian and designated school official. Online applications automatically generate approval forms to parents and school representatives via email. Students using the paper application must obtain required signatures before submitting their application.
- Pay the \$10.00 non-refundable application fee. Checks can be made payable to Regional Youth Leadership. Online applications may submit fee using a credit card at the time of their application.

ACT PREP JUNIOR ACT

The in-school ACT for our juniors will be On March 8. All juniors will be registered through the school for this test. This year, we are happy to announce our partnership with a Kentucky-based tutoring and test prep company Free Test Prep Online (FTPO) and its founder Timothy Ward. Mr. Ward is a Virtus certified 2009 graduate of the University of Notre Dame, and in 2021, he ran a free ACT program for Covington Latin School. This year, he has expanded the program to include all the schools in the Covington Diocese. As part of our partnership with FTPO, Mr. Ward will be hosting a free webinar– How to Raise Your Child's Worst ACT Subject Score by 8 Points for FREE– for all our parents on Wednesday, January 26, at 7 PM ET. The 30-minute webinar will give you simple, free, and low cost strategies to help your student prepare for the ACT (the next ACT is coming up early March!) Mr. Ward will also be announcing another free program exclusive to the schools in the Covington Diocese.
