



HANDBOOK HIGHLIGHT

Notes from parents requesting that students be permitted to leave school early should be brought to the school office before school so an early release slip can be issued. It is important that the student take care of this when she arrives at school for attendance purposes. Whatever class the student is in at the time of dismissal, she is to present the slip to the teacher at the start and may leave five minutes prior to the time stated on the slip. All students must be signed out of the building in the school office before they leave. A student can sign herself out if she is driving. If the student returns to school, she must report to the school office, so she can be readmitted to classes.


